New Budget Also Trims Income Tax

London, April 9 (AP)-Britain's Conservative government announced today a cut of 100 million pounds in the taxes Britons pay for entertainment, gasoline and some household goods. But the tax for owning a TV set went up. The cut, equivalent to \$280 mil-ion, was disclosed in the House of Commons by Peter Thorneycroft, chancellor of the Exchequer, in outlining the new budget.


