Thorpe Raps Deer Hunting Law in State

State Capitol, Hartford, April 10.—Director Lyle Thorpe of the State Department of Fisheries and Game said today that Connecticut's laws regarding deer hunting are so bad that any change in the Legislature would be an improvement.

Thorpe said his department knows that there are many properties in Connecticut that are purchased or leased for the exclusive purpose of having the privilege of shooting deer twelve months a year in unrestricted numbers.

Present law permits property owners or lessees to obtain permits to hunt deer on their property during certain seasons, and also permits the killing of deer the year-round on property where they are considered a nuisance to agriculture.

Among the abuses connected with the present law, Thorpe cited to the committee: "Existing loopholes concerning the issuance of permits to persons who claim to be lessees."

Land Bought for Purpose
Thorpe said his department knows that there are many properties in Connecticut that are purchased or leased for the exclusive purpose of having the privilege of shooting deer twelve months a year in unrestricted numbers.

"No other state in the nation," he added, "allows such exploitation of a valuable wild life species. Reversal of these laws is long overdue."

Talking to a reporter before the hearing, Thorpe said 4,087 property owners or lessees reported last year 509 deer in Connecticut kill year.

Two bear and arrow bills were before the committee, one providing a 10-day season and the other a one-month season. Thorpe said he would support either one.

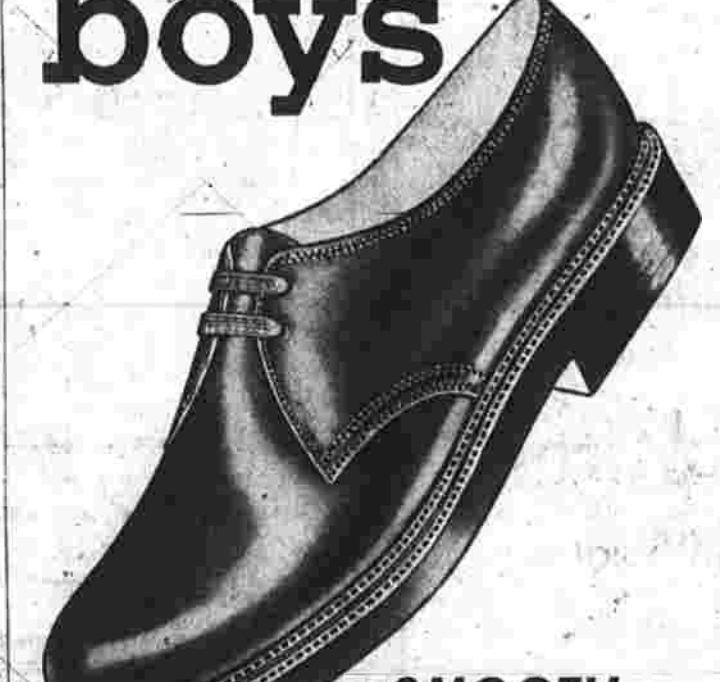

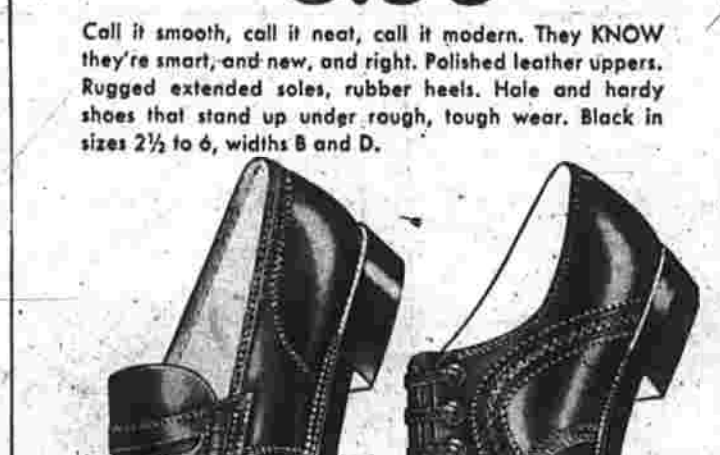

Immigrants from England Finding Homes in Canada

Toronto, Canada (NPA)—Since the end of World War II, almost 200,000 British immigrants have come to Canada. Most of them like everything about their new homeland—except the personal supermarkets.

They're used to the tiny shops in England where personal service is the thing. In Canada—especially the big cities like Toronto—they find the huge shopping centers and the huge schools somewhat disconcerting.

Most British immigrants fit in after a year, says John M. Burke, himself a newcomer and president of the Toronto branch of the British Overseas League.

The woman who fits in the least adaptable—shopping, you know. But usually after a year they become accustomed to Canadian ways of life. We find less than one per cent of the immigrants express a desire to return to England.

One of them who isn't sure is Margret Buck. She's flying back to England to visit her family this summer. She had a tough struggle at first in Canada.

But that doesn't seem to stop her. She's now working on a farm at Ottawa. She's doing so well that she's been offered a job in the city.

Others have found it easier. Bert Harrison, an aircraft designer in England, answered an ad in an English newspaper for design work in a Canadian plant.

"I had my initial difficulties," Dan says. "It took four weeks to find the first job-handling merchandise in a warehouse. Not exactly what I was looking for. Then came the first week, a clerical job in a custom broker's office. In September one of the letters I had written before leaving England landed me my present job in the secretarial department of a large concern. We sent for Derek in August, 1955.

Derek is having the hardest time of all. He's a young man from London. He's not used to the cold weather. He's also not used to the long hours. But he's determined to stay.

Senate Votes Nomination of Judge Klau

Hartford, April 10 (AP)—The State Senate approved overwhelmingly yesterday the nomination of Democrat Joseph E. Klau as a common pleas judge, but the House gave somewhat rougher treatment to the nomination of Justice Richard J. Daly to be chief justice of the State Supreme Court in 1962.

Both Houses of the State Legislature are controlled by Republicans.

Klau's nomination was closely watched because in 1941 he was rejected by the Assembly. The Senate vote was 25-2.

The House approved Daly in a secret ballot, 141-42. It made Daly's nomination final on April 10 (AP-5).

Both Houses gave unanimous or close to unanimous approval to other judicial nominations from Gov. Abraham A. Ribicoff, a Democrat.

Senate Votes Nomination of Judge Klau

Hartford, April 10 (AP)—The State Senate approved overwhelmingly yesterday the nomination of Democrat Joseph E. Klau as a common pleas judge, but the House gave somewhat rougher treatment to the nomination of Justice Richard J. Daly to be chief justice of the State Supreme Court in 1962.

Lack of 'Hot' Blood in Broncs Slowing Down Western Rodeos

By JOHN M. BRUNER
Denver (AP)—A shortage of good bucking horses is threatening to make western rodeo as dull as an eastern horse show as the season approaches.
"Take the word of Verne Elliott of Fayetteville, Colo., a rodeo hand for half a century.
"The best of these riding bucking horses, there are no more big horse outfits, like there used to be. And the horses aren't tough. . . . Top bucking horses today aren't any better than my second or third string even 10 years ago."
Elliott says he has little selection today. Once he can pick two or three of the best from a string of 100. Now he has to pick a dozen from half as many prospects.
Elliott is associated with Lynn and Jake Beutler, livestock contractors of Elk City, Okla., for the million dollar rodeo industry.
The solution?
"I don't know. Maybe we'll have to start bucking Friesians or some thing. I do know one thing. We've got to get some hot blood (roughbred strain) into what horses are left if we get an good buckers. There are mostly of the Clydesdale strain and they don't bleed. And they don't ship well."
There's a lot of quarter horses being raised, but they don't make good bucking stock.
Quarter horses were developed in the early days of the west. They are fast for about a mile, and are extremely agile in working cattle.
Maybe a fellow could, if he thought it was worth the gamble and he could make some money, cross breed some horses. Then he'd have to raise the crossbreeds when they were young to make buckers. The best buckers you get are horses that have been spotted when they were young, Elliott said.
By "spotting" Elliott did not mean physical abuse. Prignt from a business and I'm glad, but it's been good to me and I've run all right."
Elliott began contesting in the 1910s. He became associated with the late Eddie McCarthy of Cheyenne in rodeo contesting in 1921. They, with the late Austin of New York City, produced the first Madison Square Garden rodeo in 1922.
Elliott and McCarthy, and later Elliott by himself, owned what are regarded as two of the greatest bucking horses of all time—Midnight and Five Minutes in 1921.
Both are buried on Elliott's ranch near Fayetteville, where they broke the pattern when

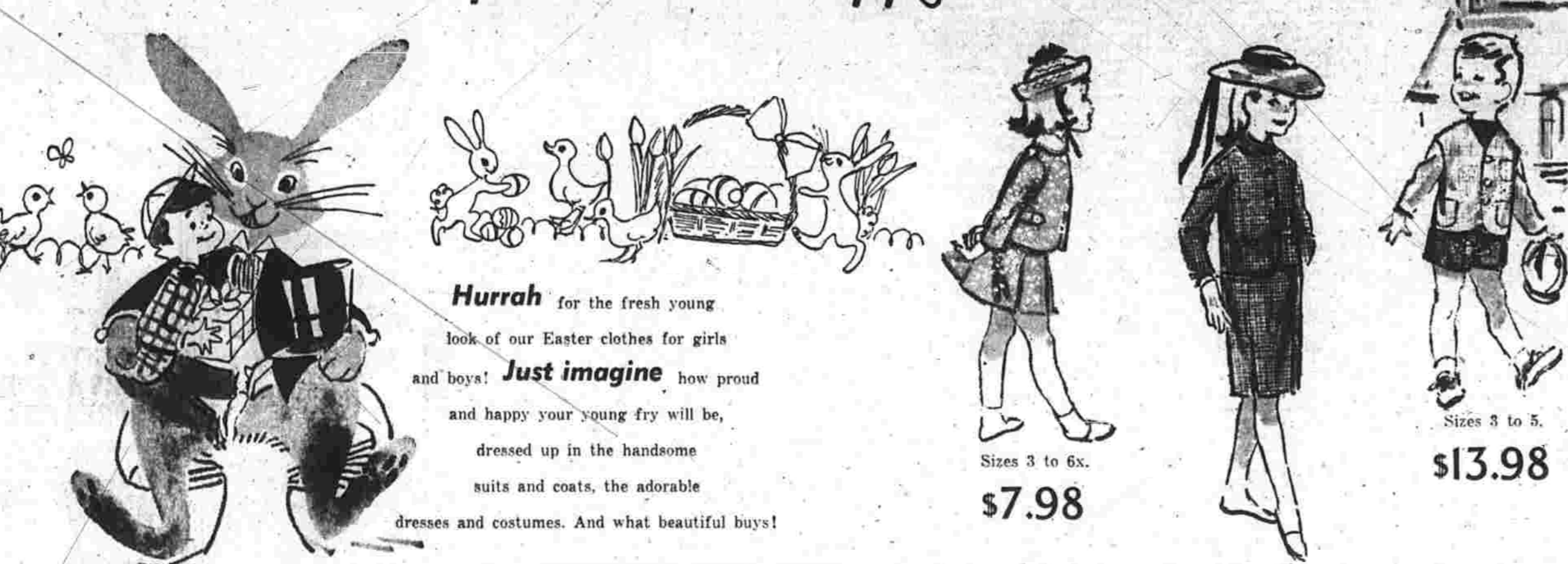

Many Flee Chlorine Gases; 29 Made Ill

Elwood City, Pa., April 11 (AP)—Chlorine gases escaping from a leaking railroad tank car early today made a score of persons ill and forced evacuations of a large area near this western Pennsylvania community.

Elwood City hospital reported that it had treated a total of 29 persons, many of them members of volunteer fire companies. Six persons were admitted for further treatment...

A worker wearing an oxygen-supplied mask succeeded in shutting off the escaping chlorine gas that was boiling from the tank car about an hour after the leak was discovered.

Residents of the tiny community of Frisco, where the leak developed, were returning to their homes as the tanks were being washed away by the gases.

The tank car, parked on a railroad siding, was estimated to contain perhaps 50,000 pounds of a chlorine compound used in the manufacture of a bleaching fluid.

It was assigned to Elson Laboratories Inc., which has a plant in the town of Frisco, 25 miles northwest of Pittsburgh.

When I got to our plant you could see this greenish-yellow vapor boiling out of the top of the car.

"It was rolling up down the Connoqueening Creek valley. There were a dozen ambulances, and firemen were going to neighboring houses, taking out people who had been made ill and going to get out.
