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Reports Ready On Results of School Parley

Glastonbury, April 11 (Special)—The Steering Committee of the Education Conference held 10 days ago plan to meet with the Board of Education next to discuss the conclusions of the Conference on local educational questions.

Conference Chairman Judge Walter Downes made the announcement. He revealed that full reports on the Conference will be mailed to all participants this week. They will include the final summary of each subject discussed and general conclusions of the Steering Committee.

Recommendations made in each subject area are: Elementary curriculum; more uniform teaching methods and curriculum content; evaluation of academic achievement of pupils in local schools in relation to those in similar schools; closer contact between school and home.

Secondary curriculum: More parent education and teacher cooperation; year study evaluation to be developed. Welles Turnpike Library to be opened on Saturdays, more books on a high school level.

Special abilities: Greater effort to identify and evaluate gifted children, grouping by ability in secondary school, more help from State Department of Education in teaching gifted children, use of community resources to enrich program, extension of guidance services.

Attracting and keeping good teachers: Teacher apprentice plan, careful study of merit evaluation of teachers, study of rules and regulations of each school made available to parents.

Building and finance: Study of utilization of present facilities to greater extent to lighten district fiscal year for the town.

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British Arms Cutback Adds to U.S. Burden

 London, April 11 (AP)—Britain's new position in missile-age defense politics is to be a major factor in the U.S. burden to maintain the shield of U.S. power.

The nation's new revolutionary 5-year defense plan also signals likely political realignments that one day might reshape the British empire.

Under the plan, Britain's armed forces will be nearly halved by 1960. The Royal Navy, longtime symbol of British striking power, also will be about halved. Missiles will replace warships and rocket regiments will take the place of some with guns and bayonets.

An one immediate result, London has decided to standardize its weapons wherever possible to U.S. patterns. Prime Minister Robert Menzies explained this in his speech in the House of Commons last week. He said that to maintain supply lines to Southeast Asia and New Zealand is to be a major task of the new defense plan.

Malaya, due to become an independent Commonwealth state in August, is expected to be planning to join the U.S.-sponsored Southeast Asian Treaty Organization (SEATO) as the ninth member and so qualify for U.S. military help.

Reduced Garrison

The British intend to maintain reduced garrisons in such Asian colonies as Singapore and Hong Kong. But in the event of war these areas would be in exactly the same position as Australia and New Zealand and Malaysia if Britain tried to hold on to them. The United States would have to rely primarily on the United States for supplies and weapons.

The main cutback in British sea power would be in the Royal Navy. Royal naval strength east of Suez will be kept as low as possible at the present level. This consists of the East Indian Squadron (one cruiser, four frigates) and the Far Eastern Fleet (one cruiser, five destroyers, five frigates, a dispatch vessel and several smaller ships).

The scaling down of British warships and bases west of Suez will be compensated by training groups around aircraft carriers and missiles.

Kadar Seen Set to Delay Hungary Vote

Budapest, April 11 (AP)—Well-known sources say Premier Janos Kadar and his Communist cabinet are planning to postpone parliamentary elections in Hungary for at least two years.

This comes on the heels of Kadar's recent visit to Moscow. The present parliament was chosen in 1953 on a single ticket ballot. No opposition was allowed, but fellow traveling members of other parties were given some seats. Its term expires on May 17 of this year.

Well informed sources say Parliament will meet before that date and prolong the term for two years. Some members are to be added to replace former Communist party boss Matyas Rakosi and others of his close followers who are now in Russia.

The "National Committee" Premier Janos Nagy, ousted by Kadar last fall, was not a member.

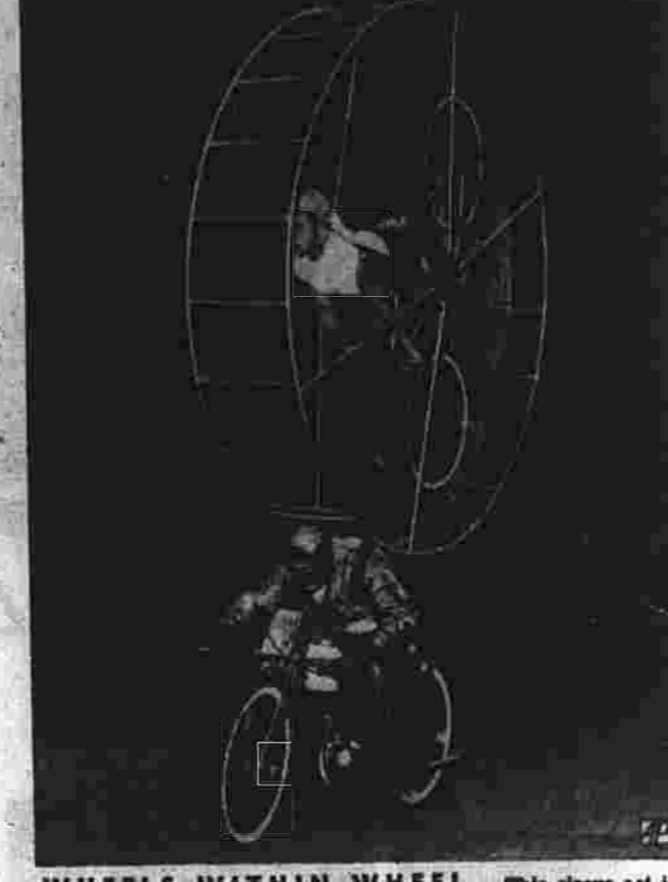

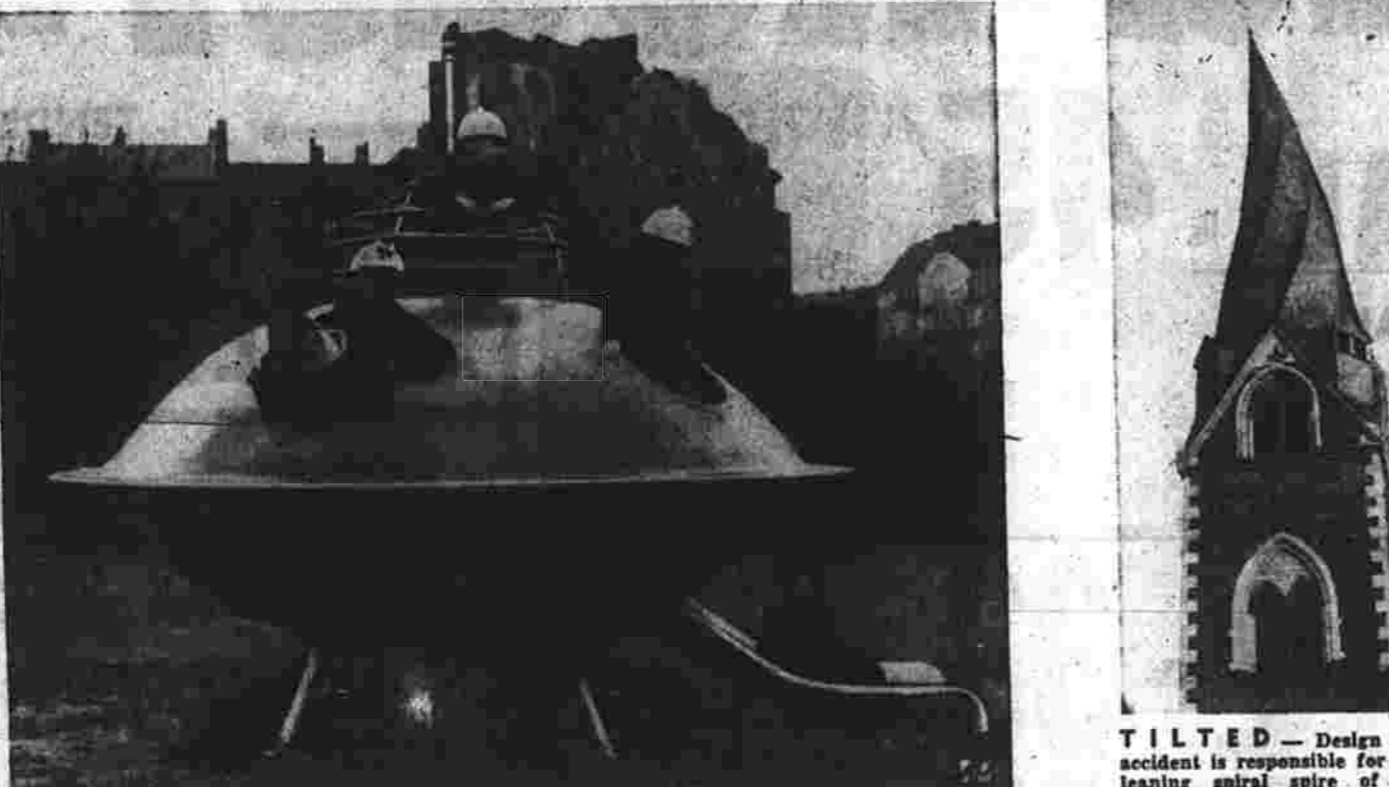

Consolidation Issues To Be Aired Tonight

The pros and cons of consolidating the Eighth District and Utilities District with the town will be presented at Rowers School tonight at 8 o'clock, on the eve of elections concerning the District's fate.

Voters in the Eighth District go to the polls tomorrow at Hillside Street School from 6 to 9 p.m. to vote on two questions: Five and seven consolidation.

Martin Alvord, Town Planning Commission chairman, called the informal meeting to have a "friendly and informative discussion on the question of consolidation."

Sitting as a panel tonight will be Rep. Ray Warren, General Manager Richard Martin, Charles McCormick, chairman of the Fire Protection and Utilities Study Committee, and Alvord.

Eighth District President Leon Thory declined an invitation to take part in the panel saying his position as president of the District prevents him from doing so. He also said the fate of the District is no concern of the TPC.

However, Alvord disagrees with Thory, saying the TPC is interested in the District in a planning sense and will present a large scale map showing the development of the District and surrounding territory.

One of the main questions asked of Martin will be one should you spend \$50,000 in fire protection when estimates of the cost of fire protection are expected to be only \$10,000.

In a letter to the Editor of the Herald printed in the April 10 column, Warren says the Grand List of the District will be "conservatively \$28 million." At a minimum, the figure used by the town for total fire protection, Warren says, the tax will yield \$50,000, or \$3,000 more from the District. However, the town intended to spend there, Warren asks: "Is this fair to the District?"

It is Warren's contention that the District is not getting a "break" from the present plans for consolidation.

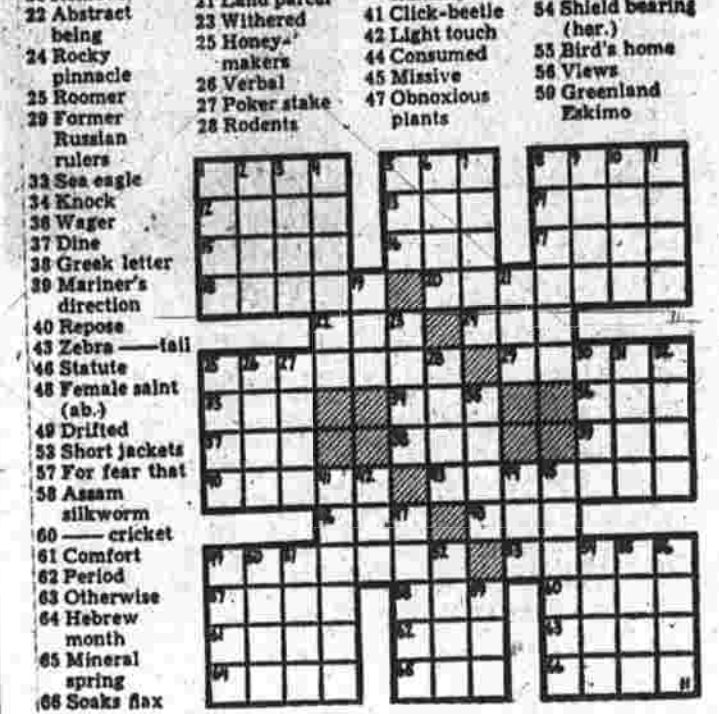
