Sweden Grabs High AEC Aide As Soviet Spy

(Continued from Page One)

performed mainly administrative functions and that he was a special expert rather than a nuclear physicist.

News of the arrest came at a time when Swedish military leaders are publicly urging the government to begin manufacturing a tactical atomic weapon to buy them from the West.

Sweden is in the forefront of small nations in the atomic energy field. Top nuclear physicist here claim the country has both the scientific and technical knowledge as well as the economic resources to make her own atomic weapons.

Sweden is also engaged in experiments on harnessing thermonuclear (hydrogen) energy for peaceful purposes.

"For a year now we have been working on a project in the field of fusion which we believe we have the economic resources to carry out," Prof. Kai Siegbahn, head of the nuclear physics department of Uppsala University, said in a recent interview.

Sweden's Atomic Energy Commission was formed in 1945. It is the supreme organ of all Swedish atomic research and receives regular reports from all Swedish universities and nuclear laboratories.

"The commission has on its staff some of the nation's best scientists, including Nobel prize winners and industrial leaders."

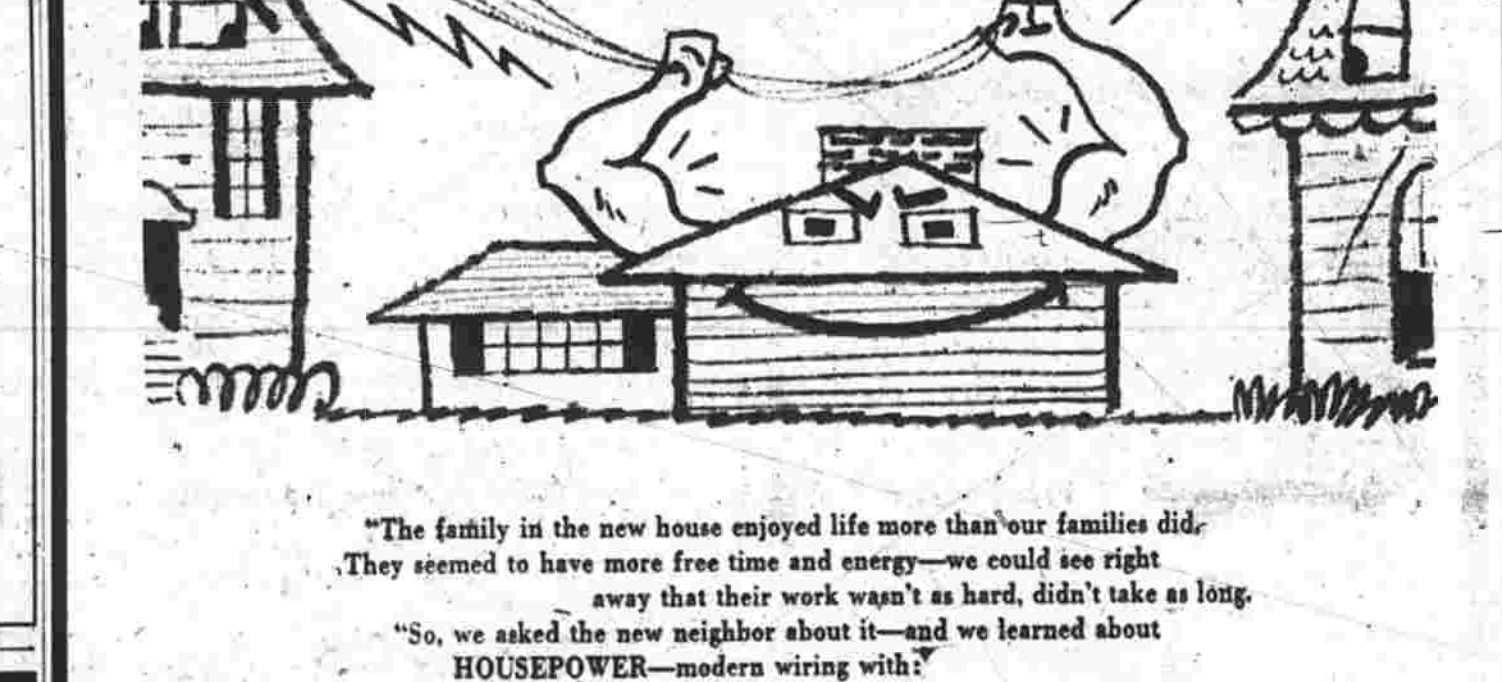

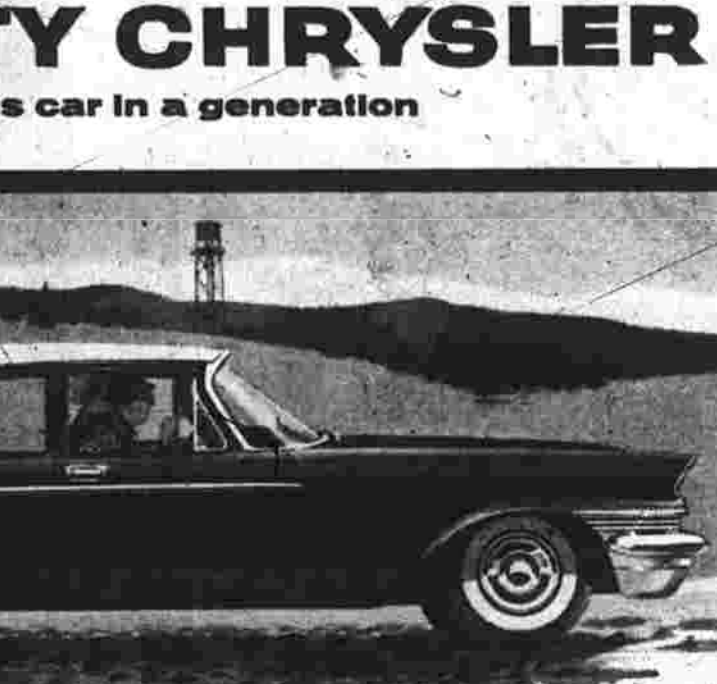



A Battle of Wills
 Postmaster General Summerfield is apparently not directly or solely responsible for the fiscal difficulty in which his department has found itself; but he is responsible for the way in which he has tried to resolve that difficulty.
 Apparently, the Budget Bureau was at fault in two ways. First, it did not prevent Summerfield from spending money at a rate which was certain to exhaust the fiscal year in June. Second, it did not authorize him to seek from Congress the additional money he was spending.
 The result was a request to Congress which came late, for a deficit which was, in fact, already in prospect. This in itself was something of a sudden demand upon Congress, even though the surprise and the suddenness of it may not have been Summerfield's fault alone.
 On the other hand, no one but Summerfield seems responsible for the way in which he chose to quarrel with Congress' quarrel with his request. He had obviously been living beyond his appropriation means for many months. Now he suddenly proclaimed he was going to follow the book so closely that he was going to cut service immediately unless Congress appropriated.
 The public which was inconvenienced or perhaps injured by his curtailment of service was supposed to get mad at Congress and beat Congress into an unconditional surrender to Summerfield.
 Perhaps this is going to be the actual result. But even if Summerfield gains an absolute victory, it is going to be one of those costly victories. He has unnecessarily invoked a war with Congress which will last as long as he remains in the Cabinet, and he has used his executive power rashly and wantonly in an effort to make the whole American people his partner in a quarrel not of dollars but of wills. He would have done better to leave the service alone, and leave the provision of dollars up to Congress, which would have provided them sooner or later anyway.

Okinawa and Cyprus
 Emphasizing that he was speaking purely as an individual, and not as a representative of the government, Mr. Price said that the professor of political science at West Point, discussed our position on Okinawa, at a session of the Association for Asia Studies, held at Boston the other day.
 Okinawa, he said, is absolutely necessary as a military base for us in Asia, and he recommended that we prepare to keep it, for at least 20 years, even if it should unfortunately become another Cyprus, with its whole population against us. We are, of late, showing some sensitiveness to native criticism on Okinawa, and to agitation in Japan, and adjusting our behavior on Okinawa in favor of the natives in some way in which he chose to quarrel with Congress' quarrel with his request.
