Business at Parkade Exceeds Expectations

George B. Collins, advertising manager of Grand Union, wrote that the experience of the Parkade in excess of expectations. Some national chains state that business volume has topped projections by as much as 40 per cent.

The remaining customers came from the general Hartford area, from as far west as New Britain and Bristol and as far south as Meriden and Thompsonville.

Speaking of the future, Reader said the experience of the first six months has encouraged the Parkade owners to plan additional features. One under consideration is the construction of a new five-story office building.

Plans were built by Green Manor Estates, Inc., which is contemplating the construction of several other shopping centers. Many Parkade tenants have expressed interest in the new building.

It was Easter week for both eastern and western Christians. They follow different calendars, but this year the dates coincide. In addition, Moslems celebrating the month-long Ramadan prayer at the Dome of the Rock, and Jews were completing their Passover holidays in the Holy Land.

At the Vatican, pilgrims from many countries assembled in St. Peter's Basilica for the annual service. The highlight of the mournful service is the slow extinguishing of all but one of 15 altar candles. The remaining candle, symbolic of Christ, was hidden in the altar. It is lit as a loud noise reminded worshippers of the convulsions of nature at the moment Jesus died.

Pope Pius XII will deliver his Easter Sunday speech to millions over a direct hookup with radio systems of nearly a score of nations. For the first time the papal address will be put on European television. He spoke at noon from the balcony above the central door of St. Peter's Basilica.

In Konnersdorf, Germany, 3,000 pilgrims gathered in the rambling castle of the Prince-Bishop of Bamberg for the annual Good Friday service. The 59-year-old Bavarian woman who each Good Friday appears to suffer the agonies of crucifixion. In 1928 she was first reported to have displayed the crucifixion stigma—marks on her body corresponding to the wounds of Christ.

Police on hand to keep order, reported the stigmatisation was reached its peak shortly before noon, the hour the bible says Christ was nailed to the cross. Last year the woman was so sick to have visitors troop through her home. But this year pilgrims were again allowed inside and reported signs of bleeding on her hands, feet and head.

For the first time since the war a group from Poland journeyed here to witness the event. Hundreds of American soldiers also were part of the drenched crowd.

It is estimated that more than 200,000 persons have seen Therese Neumann's agonies at most Good Friday services of the past 15 years. Roman Catholic church authorities have recognized the stigmatisation, but they have never admitted Catholics that her experiences are not genuine.

During her agonies Miss Neumann claims to experience an "ecstasy" accompanied by holy visions.

According to the published accounts of her life, Therese Neumann, the daughter of a tailor, was blinded and partly paralyzed by an accident at the age of 20. Her strength was reported to have stored five years later on the day that the French nurse Therese Neumann was hospitalized. The paralysis is said to have disappeared completely two years later when the nun was canonized.

spending far too much on the administrative posts.

As it was sent to Eisenhower, the only major item in the measure aside from the \$275 million of public assistance funds was \$45 million for small business loans. The Small Business Administration has notified Congress it has been making loans only on a contingent basis since February.

Omitted from the legislation for later consideration were funds asked by the President for farm ownership loans, disaster loans and conservation measures in drought areas such as wind erosion control.
