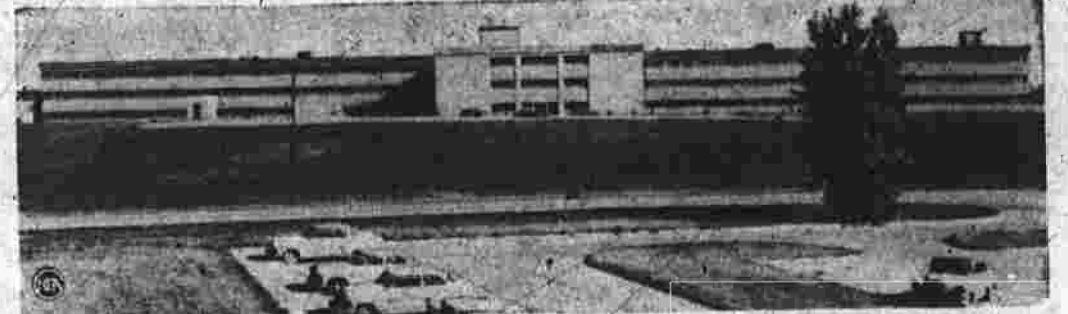

Strategic Air Command Has Nerve Center Under Ground

Crest Air Force Base, Omaha, Neb. (NEA) — If Russian leaders could see what I have just seen, the threat of World War III would be ended, pronto.

I've just had a tour of the amazing new underground command center of the Strategic Air Command where the first vital command of World War III will be directed if the Russians are ever stupid enough to start it.

The underground command center gives maximum protection to SAC commanders and the heart of its vital communications network against enemy air attack.



At ground level, SAC Headquarters looks like this. Beneath it is command center.

But, far more important, by combining SAC's war plans, operations control system, latest intelligence data and secret new communications systems into one highly-coordinated center, the inherent time advantage which an attacker gains by surprise has been shaved to a matter of seconds.

When something like 80 seconds after it is known that an enemy is making war against the U.S., orders will be going out from here directing that enemy's war potential.



Before you ever get to the ramp leading to the underground command center, you must be screened by three sets of tough Air Police who wouldn't let a fly without the proper identification and a badge with a red slash across it.

At the final entrance, tougher armed Air Police make you sign a register, double-check your credentials and provide an escort to the must stay at your post for the duration of the inspection.

The steep concrete ramp leads you down the equivalent of three blocks of earth, through three sets of thick double doors. You pass the decontamination room for those who aren't able to scrub their hands before getting some radiation from enemy bombs.

Only a direct hit by a large nuclear weapon could hurt personnel inside the command center. More than 15,000 yards of concrete were used in the underground structure, which has several acres of floor space.

If necessary, the center could keep operating completely built up for more than 90 days. It has an independent water supply and is kept stocked with food. Secret information and other charts and maps present a mass of secret information necessary to a commander directing strategic global air operations against an enemy.

Opposite this array of panels, on a glass-enclosed balcony, is where SAC's dramatic boss Gen. Curtis E. LeMay will sit and direct his far-flung operations.

If necessary, the center could keep operating completely built up for more than 90 days. It has an independent water supply and is kept stocked with food. SAC's War Room

The most spectacular section of the underground command center is a large amphitheater—SAC's war room. Across one side are brilliantly-colored charts and maps, mounted to slatted panels. On the panel, for example, is a map of the world showing de-labeled global weather conditions, kept accurate to the hour. Another weather map gives long-range global predictions based on reports coming in constantly from all over the world. Such things as the speed and location of the weather jet streams are plotted. This is important information to SAC's bomber pilots.

World-wide weather conditions at any moment would have a direct bearing on the war plans which would be put into effect in case of an attack.

On another panel is a map showing the exact daily status of SAC's forces, kept current by IBM calculators. It takes electronic brains to keep daily track of SAC's more than 3,000 bombers and 200,000 people scattered all over the world.

This panel shows at a glance how many bomber crews are on leave at each base, how many aircraft might be having an engine changed and how many bombers are sitting on runways, ready to take off on a mission.

Another map shows the position of every SAC plane in the air at the moment, another important factor governing the war plans.
