Ike Urged To Appeal For Budget

Washington, May 1 (AP)—President Eisenhower is considering a direct appeal to the people, by radio television, on behalf of his budget and foreign aid program. The White House indicated he may follow the same pattern on other issues.

Washington, May 1 (AP)—Republican congressional leaders advised President Eisenhower today to go to the people with an appeal for his budget and his foreign aid program.

Sen. GOP Leader Knowland of California told reporters there was a general discussion of the weekly White House session of key party lawmakers of a presidential radio-television address to the nation.

He said it was the view of the congressional leadership generally that the President "should talk to the people."

"I think," Knowland said, "it would be very helpful on this issue and on other issues as they come along."

Nothing was worked out, he said. In the way of a possible time for Eisenhower to address the country. Both the \$4,000,000,000 Foreign Aid program and the \$71,800,000,000 budget as a whole have been targets of a congressional economy drive.

Knowland himself has called for a \$3 billion waiver at the budget. House Republican Leader Martin of Massachusetts has taken a similar stance.

Knowland left the impression that in spite of his own stand on the budget matter he still favors taking the administration case to the people.

Ahead of the White House session Knowland pledged his best efforts to keep Congress in session until it acts on Civil Rights and

Sen. Byrd Asks Budget's Chief Be Replaced

Washington, May 1 (AP)—Sen. Byrd (D-Va.) today called for the replacement of budget director Perot F. Brundage.

At the same time the Virginia Senator plugged for an \$8 billion to \$9 billion cut in President Eisenhower's pending \$71,800,000,000 budget.

Byrd said he does not expect all of such a reduction right now.

Applauding a speech by Byrd before the United States Chamber of Commerce when he demanded an end to the "squandering" of public money and said Brundage's removal would be "very helpful."

Brundage, director of the Budget Bureau for 13 months, declined to make any comment on Byrd's remarks.

Byrd, who spends much of his energy pushing for economy, told the businessmen at their 45th annual meeting.

"Next year we may be so fortunate as to have another budget director—a budget director dedicated to economy instead of apparently dedicated to finding new ways to spend money and new ways to spend money on the present budget."

Butthorled later by reporters, Byrd said he was not calling for Brundage's resignation—"that's up to the President. It's not for me to demand the resignation."

Byrd has added, "I think Mr. Brundage has made a failure of his present budget."

"He has introduced increases all the way down the line. I think this budget is unduly and unnecessarily wasteful."

Now I See the Bard Says . . . Ike Says Tax Cut Depends on Peace

Washington, May 1 (AP)—President Eisenhower declared today that he would like to go out of office "with an ever bigger tax cut" than in 1954.

But he said that all he would like to accomplish in the field of economy and tax reductions comes back finally to the problem of foreign policy. His stand was that big savings depend on peaceful developments in the world.

And, upholding his foreign aid program, he urged: "Let's not throw away one of the engines of the Ship of State."

Foreign aid funds have been a principal target of budget cutters in Congress.

Eisenhower talked about foreign policy and aid for nearly 20 minutes in an off-the-cuff speech in the White House Rose Garden to the League of Women Voters of the United States. He bubbled along eloquently and sometimes emotionally.

Most Understand Truths
Understand the simple truths about the matter and are ready to push through the needed measures. He said "the future doesn't look nearly as bright as it should."

"But if the nation does understand the need of sacrificing money, Eisenhower said, this sacrifice won't look nearly so great as the sacrifice of our sons on the battlefield."

"You can't take freedom and allow it to be pushed back to the shores of the United States and keep freedom here."

"A foreign policy," Eisenhower said, "is not difficult to state: We are for peace, first, last and always."

But he said, too, that "as long as there is abroad a predatory force seeking to destroy our form of government, we are going to remain strong."

Eisenhower described the spirit of nationalism as the strongest force abroad in the world today—stronger than the spirit of communism, stronger in some places than the spirit of anti-communism.

Reds Assail West In May Day Talks

The Communists held the center of the stage today in most May Day celebrations around the world. There were the usual parades, rallies and a rash of anti-western speeches to mark Labor's day outside the United States.

Red orators in Europe and Asia denounced western "imperialism" and boasted of Communist efforts to attain world peace.

Soviet Defense Minister Georgi Zhukov assured a vast May Day gathering in Moscow's Red Square today that Russian military forces have "all the modern means of combat necessary to rout any aggressor."

Charges U.S. for War
Zhukov also accused the western powers of rejecting Soviet peace bids and charged the United States with bringing war nearer by deciding "to station atomic units on territories of other countries."

So much for a speech, broadcast by Moscow Radio, was filled with protestations of the Kremlin's peaceful desires and pleas for peaceful coexistence.

Beck Sends Union Aids To Hearing

Washington, May 1 (AP)—Dave Beck told the AFL-CIO today the Teamsters Union Executive Board will attend Monday's hearing by the federation's Ethical Practices Committee on charges the union is corruptly dominated.

There had been uncertainty whether the Teamsters Union would send representatives to the hearing—an initial step toward possible eventual ouster of the 2½-million member union from the AFL-CIO.

Beck, the Teamsters president, and the union itself are under fire from the AFL-CIO because of Beck's admitted personal use of some union funds and because of pending indictments against several other top Teamster officials.

Beck under temporary suspension as an AFL-CIO vice president and council member, faces an AFL-CIO Executive Council trial of his own right Monday.

To Show Up in Body
Beck today notified Al Hayes, chairman of the AFL-CIO Ethical Practices Committee and president of the Machinists Union, that the Teamsters Executive Board will show up—in a body—for the ethical hearing Monday.

That session involves the union itself.

U.S. Unmoved Over Rebuff to Ike's Doctrine

Washington, May 1 (AP)—State Department officials pressed today to be unswayed by King Hussein's rebuff to President Eisenhower's Middle East program.

Hussein has accepted an American offer of \$10 million to help strengthen his country's economy and finances and presumably also to assist in meeting the payroll for his army.

But he told a news conference at Amman yesterday that Jordan is not interested in the "Eisenhower Doctrine." The King also commented that he had declined a visit to Eisenhower's special ambassador in the Middle East, James P. Richards, because Jordan was not interested in the Eisenhower program.

Officials here said that acceptance of the program was not particularly important because Hussein is in fact working along the same lines that the program itself would call for.

The United States policy laid down in a resolution by Congress in March is aimed at opposing the spread of Communist power and influence in the Middle East and promoting stability within Middle Eastern countries.

State Department officials said on the basis of the record there are also Hussein's aims and that the United States has supported him for that reason.

Hussein, the Arab, has cut out Communist propaganda in his country to the fullest extent possible.

State Dept. Hit For Protesting Cut in Budget

Washington, May 1 (AP)—Senate Democratic Leader Johnson of Texas accused the State Department today of drawing "a very false picture of the effect of House cuts in its budget."

Johnson told Loy W. Henderson, deputy undersecretary of state, that testimony by the department created the impression that the House denied funds to finance programs which Congress itself made "mandatory."

The House voted the department \$190,382,743, a cut of \$47,351,809 from President Eisenhower's request for the fiscal year starting July 1, and \$41,317,329 less than was provided this fiscal year.

Secretary of State Dulles appealed yesterday for restoration of \$29,270,000 of the House cut.

No Funds for Pay-Hike
Henderson testified today that the House made no provisions for payment of more than \$1 million in salary increases for top ranking officers.

He also said the House took no action on a request for \$58,240 for congressionally authorized increases in allowances for maintenance of official residences, and on another request for \$351,566 for authorized medical care of foreign service dependents abroad.

Johnson told Henderson that he had created a very false picture by leaving the impression the House had made it impossible to carry out the congressional authorizations.

Henderson checked with the clerk of the House Appropriations Committee and reported there is no language in either the House bill or the Appropriations Committee report which would prevent use of other appropriated funds for salaries and expenses for the functions Henderson mentioned.

He said the House did not intend to take any action on the request for a pay-hike when Congress is in a vulnerable position when it reduces requests for appropriations.

"If you use funds for these purposes you may have less to use for personnel."

Johnson complained yesterday that the State Department is "costing us about twice what it cost in 1953." He was especially critical of the expense of the State Department's special operations.

Along the same line Sen. Knowland of California, the Republican leader, served notice today that no action would be expected to add to its working force in the fiscal year starting July 1.

Johnson directed State Department officials to address themselves to a request for \$1 million and to make out a case for their own use.

Defense Challenges All Jury Prospects

Hartford, May 1 (AP)—Defense counsel at the Taborsky-Culombe murder trial in Superior Court today challenged the qualifications of all prospective jurors, thus far summoned for service in the case, including the six accepted but not yet sworn in for duty.

They claimed the method of selecting citizens for jury service was illegal and they proposed to summon as witnesses members of the jury committees in all 29 towns of Hartford County.

Judge James C. Shannon, at the request of State Atty. Albert S. Bill, declared a recess until 3 p. m. so that both sides could prepare for arguing the motion and for the production of needed witnesses.

All in Same Political Party
In Hartford and East Hartford, he said, the jury-committee members were all members of the same political party, in violation of state law.

Secret Vote of CAB Leaked in 3 Hours

Washington, May 1 (AP)—Robert R. Snodgrass, GOP national committee chairman for Georgia, testified today he made a quick profit on Northeast Airlines stock last August after receiving a report the airline might be awarded a New York-Miami run.

Snodgrass said he had no idea any improper "leak" of information might be involved and would not have known the stock deal if he had made that.

Washington, May 1 (AP)—A Delta Airlines executive testified today he got a report his line had lost its bid for a New York-Miami run within less than three hours after the Civil Aeronautics Board (CAB) made a "secret" decision to give it to Northeast Airlines.

The CAB had voted 3-2 about 9 p. m. that night to award the profitable run to Northeast but did not announce its decision officially until Aug. 10.

Heavy Trading Next Day
There was heavy trading in Northeast stock on Aug. 3, the day after the CAB's secret decision,

West Cool To Siberian Air Check

Bonn, Germany, May 1 (AP)—Foreign Ministers of the 15 Atlantic Allies, assembling here today for a 3-day meeting, were expected to recommend intensive negotiations on Russia's latest disarmament proposals. Initial western reaction to the Soviet plan was generally cool.

The Soviet proposals, announced last night by Moscow Radio, were certain to be a major topic at the talks opening in Bonn tomorrow on mutual political problems of the NATO nations.

U.S. Secretary of State Dulles arrived by plane from Washington this morning, accompanied by a large delegation of advisers.

Dulles said "we will seek to assure our own people the blessings of justice and peace."

A special 4-engine plane of the U.S. Air Force landed the Secretary and Mrs. Dulles in brilliant sunshine after a direct flight from Washington. Dulles acknowledged a round of applause from thousands of persons at the airport with a jaunty wave of his hat and then drove directly to the headquarters of West German Chancellor Konrad Adenauer. A dinner conference was expected to concern such matters as the U.S. program of equipping the Bonn Republic's emerging armed forces.

Talks Open Tomorrow
Soviet Russia's latest disarmament proposals, announced last night, were certain to be a major topic at the talks opening in Bonn tomorrow on mutual political problems of the 16 NATO nations. Initial western reaction to the Soviet proposals, which included a limited acceptance of President Eisenhower's "open skies" inspection plan, was generally cool.

Dulles made a direct reference to that in a statement on his arrival.

Britain's Lord Ismay, NATO's acting secretary-general, told reporters in a preview of talks facing the Allied foreign ministers that a new appraisal of NATO defense strategy will be ready next August.

He said the military planners almost certainly will recommend that the member nations accept nuclear equipment for their air, land and sea forces. He stressed:

Coventry More Classrooms Alternative To Double Sessions in 1958

Coventry, May 1 (Special)—Town boardmen and food sale Saturday public schools face double sessions unless additional classrooms are built for the school year 1958-59. The matter, which has been a long project for construction for the school program is established unless the town boardmen can find a way out except to institute double sessions at the start of that school year. These statements are based on a report recently given by the Board of Education, according to Chairman Russell D. Potter, by the Citizens Study Committee on School Housing Needs.

The board has informed the town it is taking appropriate steps to seek approval for the construction of a 15-room junior high school to care for the projected enrollment for the 1958-59 year. The estimated cost of the project was set at \$175,000 by the board, based on the conclusions and recommendations of the Study Committee. Chairman Potter has stated:

The conclusions and recommendations are based on the fact that state grants for construction of secondary schools amount to \$400 per pupil, or one-third the cost, whichever is less. This compares to \$200, or one-third the cost, whichever is less, for primary school construction. A ninth grade must be included in a local program to qualify for secondary school status.

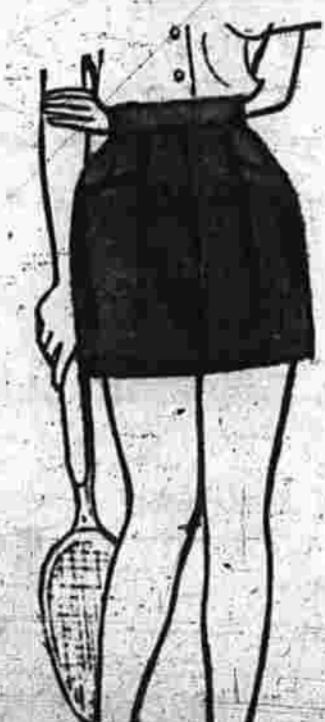

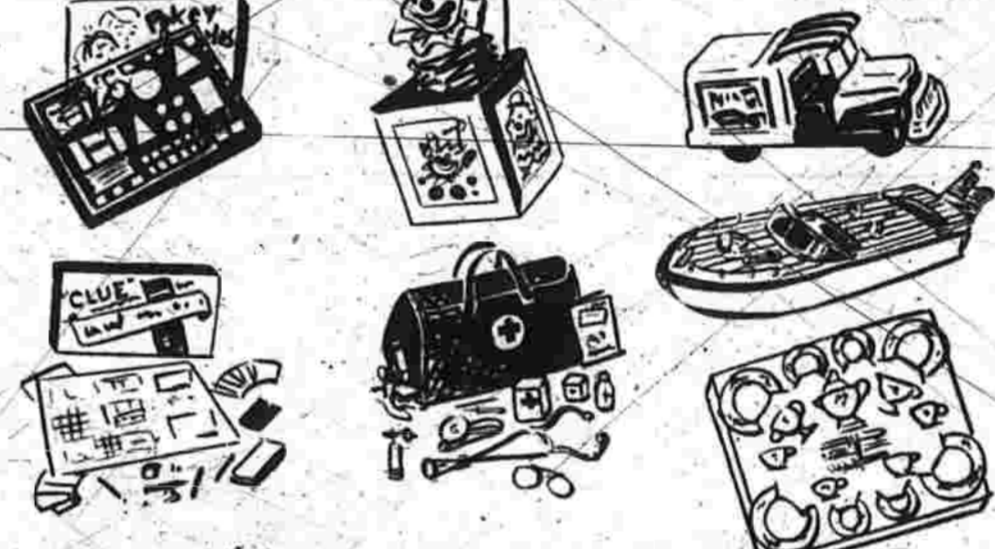

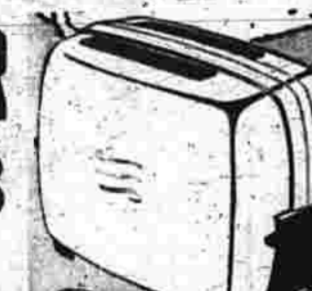

Bill Would Share State's Share of Rides to School

Hartford, Conn., May 1.—The Legislature's Education Committee has approved and sent to the Appropriations Committee a bill to share the state's share of transportation costs by more than \$150,000 a year. The Appropriations Committee must approve the measure before they can be presented to the General Assembly. The bill would require the state to pay 50 per cent of the cost of transporting elementary school children to towns of less than 1,000 population; the amount to increase \$55 a pupil a year. Other towns would pay 50 per cent of the cost, but no more than \$30 a pupil.

Transportation Outlay from Present 200 Million Dollars a Year

Transportation outlay from the present 200 million dollars a year is slightly more than \$1,000,000. The bill would require the state to pay 50 per cent of the cost of transporting elementary school children from \$500,000 a year to \$1,250,000. Washington — (UPI) — Girls, we bargain hunters have got to look out for a new trick racket. This is a scheme called "phoney price marking" that makes shoppers out of enthusiastic money savers.

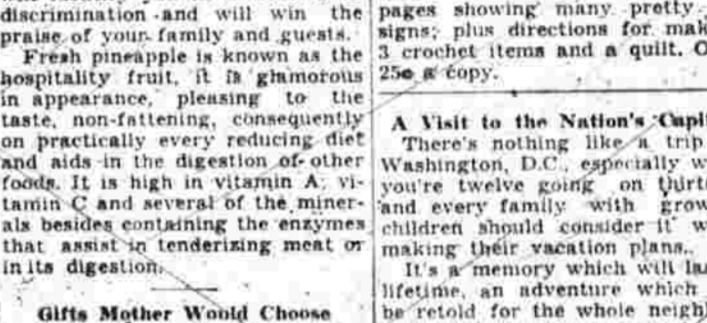

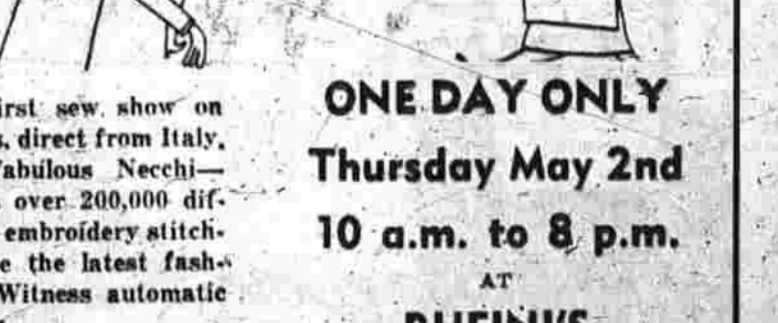

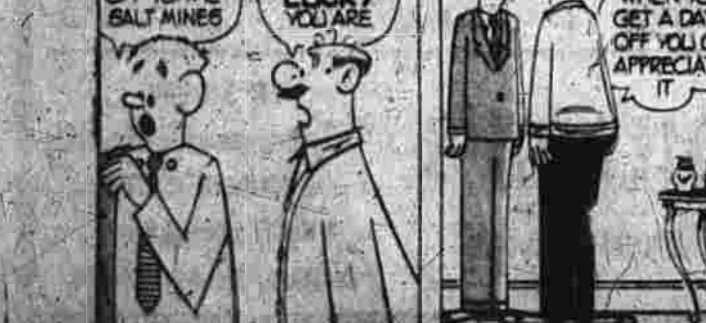
