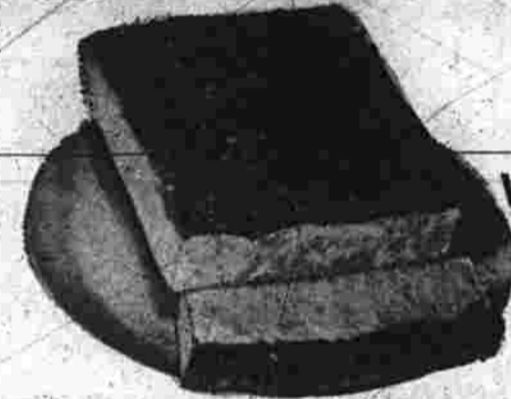

against a weapon operating against a ballistic missile. Schweiger told the committee that the plan for expanding the Strategic Air Command (SAC) force of 250 heavy bombers to 475, instead of 275 which is still under consideration, was approved by the SAC staff, which he had for the larger number of wings was needed. ## Putnam Bridge Issue Pushed by Legislator

State Senator Hartford, May 1.—First Selectman Ralph Croswell of Putnam urged today that the Legislature push the issue of the New Haven Railroad for full restoration of its rights and franchises on the line near Putnam.

Croswell said nothing has been accomplished by negotiations with the railroad, and that it does not appear that the Public Utilities Commission will make a decision before the legislative session ends on the railroad's petition to abandon the line.

That leaves "no alternative" but to appeal directly to the Legislature, said Croswell. The line in question was knocked out in August 1955, when floods washed away a trestle over the Guts River in Putnam. It has not been replaced.

Croswell, chairman of the Eastern Connecticut Committee on Public Conservation and Recreation, said he will introduce a bill for restoration of the line in the next session. He urged that the Legislature's Public Utilities Committee, which would depic a railroad of its franchise on any line where it is deemed to provide full service.

Croswell said he believed legislators from all sections of the state would support the bill because it applies in more areas than eastern Connecticut.

Reluctant to Act

House Chairman Thomas M. Jacobs (R-Barn) on charges on today's meeting that the committee is reluctant to act on the matter of the Putnam line under consideration.

Also said today is a serious question about the constitutionality of the measure.

Croswell said negotiations between his committee and the railroad produced these decisions:

- The railroad maintains that the freight service it is now providing up to the gap where the trestle was washed away is not good as the service before the flood.
- The railroad will not give up its franchise on the Putnam line voluntarily because it realizes some profit from freight service.
- After originally estimating the cost of replacing the trestle at \$350,000, the railroad has reduced the figure to \$250,000, but says some work also needs to be done on the roadway.

Croswell said he believes "a little better promotional program" on the part of the railroad might be more profitable for both passenger and freight service.

Better scheduling of passenger trains and cleaning up "diaphanous" full passenger cars would help, he said.

Cites New Turnpike

Charging that the railroad wants to abandon many of its branch lines and concentrate on main line operation, Croswell said he believes that "trains" are being abandoned because of the heavy loss of money in these routes in such a way that traffic will be light and the lines will be a better proposition.

One Windham County legislator questioned whether the railroad is proper for the General Assembly to try to compel the railroad to restore service on the line. If the line is being abandoned,

try club. Diplomats of 40 nations and the whole of Managua society had been invited. Honduras showed up but the news judgment proceeded and other top officials did not appear. These congressmen were sent home without playing a role and the party broke up at midnight.

"Legation" of the Honduran government said its Air Force units had recaptured Mocoron and that the "first Honduran arrest" had been made. The government announcement gave no details. It reported that Honduran Air Force planes were sent to the area after word was received in Tegucigalpa that Nicaraguans planes had flown to the region to support Nicaraguan ground forces. Honduras "has charged that 20 Nicaraguan soldiers invaded the territory it claims April 30."

Gen. Roque Rodriguez, a member of Honduras' 3-man ruling junta, declared Honduras was "messily repelling aggression of Nicaraguans."

Earlier, the border situation appeared to be cooling off. Honduras had canceled orders mobilizing reserves and moving troops to the border.

Shortly before his inauguration Romoza ordered a mass evacuation of all other American governments, declaring Honduras "policy" based on non-aggression. In his inaugural speech he pledged his government to seek a solution of all problems through "peaceful means."

Romoza, elected President in February, already had taken over the presidency by the end of Congress after Mr. Father, Gen. Anastasio Somoza, was assassinated last September.

Honduras contends the disputed territory belongs to Honduras as a result of a treaty by the King of Spain in 1506. Nicaragua rejected that treaty and Honduras charged that Nicaragua troops had invaded the area this month. Honduras demands their withdrawal and apologies from Nicaragua. The demands were rejected by Somoza's government. Honduras carried the case to the organization of American States, which now is debating the dispute in Washington.

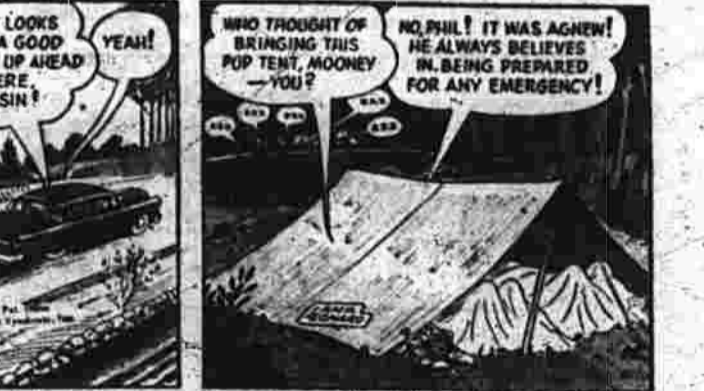
