John Hopkins Dies:
Noted Industrialist

Washington: May 4 (P)—John Jay Hopkins, described as "one of the great hullders" in American industry, died in a hospital last night of cancer. He was 63.
Hopkins was chairman of the board of General Dynamics Corpone of the nation's largest industrial complexes which last year had net sales of more than \$1 billion.

Electric Boat Co., one of the divisions of General Dynamics, built the nation's first atomic submarine, the Nautilus. Hopkins himself took an interest in the project, and he actually vorked to promote peacetime development of the atom.
