Beck and the Teamsters executive board were presented with a 22-page listing of complaints against the conduct of Teamsters officials, topped by the allegation that the union's board has demonstrated no intention of conducting an inyestigation or cleanup. The Ethical Practices Committee's detailed charges included references to Beck's refusal to tell Unions Ruled



Over the weekend, both countries claimed that the other's air force had bombed and strafed Indian villages in the disputed territory.


