

Canada Makes Profit With Postal System

Ottawa, May 9 (P) Canada's postal system operates at a profit. The reason is not hard to find. The Canadian department has been more successful than its U.S. counterpart in getting legislative approval for higher postal rates. Operating costs in both countries have spiraled, year after year. bled in 10 years, But revenue has in its struggle to stay in the black, the Canadian Post Office in 1950 eliminated one of two daily deliveries in residential areas. This change is now accepted as perma-

In only two years of the past 10 has the post office operated at a deficit. A small deficit in 1951 was offset by an increase in rates on second and third class mail.
