Beck Called To Explain More Deals

Washington, May 11 (AP)—Senate rackets probes said today they plan hearings next week on alleged "demands" by Teamsters union president Dave Beck on an employer Beck had aided with loans from union funds.

Robert F. Kennedy, counsel for the investigating Senate subcommittee, said Beck had loaned \$1.5 million in Teamsters funds to Fruehauf when Fruehauf lost control of his firm unless he got more capital. The loans were repaid, the Senators were told.

There has been testimony that later, when Beck needed money, the Fruehauf firm got a letter from the Brown Equipment Co. to lend Beck \$200,000. Kennedy said that there were other "demands" on Fruehauf by Beck and that he intends to try to develop evidence along this line.

The rackets committee has gathered a growing mass of evidence alleging that the 32-year-old Teamsters boss directed vast sums of his union money for his personal use and profit. Kennedy said Beck was trustee of the old A.P.L. Beck's profiting from funds over which he was trustee was "unethical" and "abuse of a trust."
