





Rockville, May 14 (Special)-A pecial meeting to act on separation of the Tolland County Farm Bureau and Extension Service will be held at the county office tomorrow at 8 p.m., Wesley R. Bradway, president, has announced, Plans for reorganizing the farm Bureau and establishing the Tol-land County Agricultral Extension Council will be submitted for vote.
