Not a Question of Trust

A professional military man occupying a position of trust and responsibility for the military service of his own country, there is no such thing as a good disarmament plan, unless, of course, it should be a plan which would alter the balance of power in favor of his own country.

It is no news at all, then, that Admiral Arthur Radford, chairman of our Joint Chiefs of Staff, is opposing the possibility of some disarmament agreement at the London talks.

The chief significance in his stand is that the argument he uses is one which should be known to all of us.

"We cannot trust the Russians on this or anything," says Admiral Radford bluntly.

"Most Americans, we would guess, believe this almost automatically. They believe it without being able to cite the instances in which Russia has broken its word."

If they should start the search for such instances, they could be led to find them, but they would perhaps have some difficulty making the indictment an average man would make.

"And because the Russians are the well-labeled villain of the present moment in world history, most Americans believe in the faithfulness of the Russians without bothering to compare it realistically with the record of other nations for purposes of honest appraisal."

"Russia would certainly not have any disarmament agreement if it proved, in practice, to be something which weakened Russia in relation to us."

"Nor would we keep any disarmament agreement if it would find that, in practice, it gave Russia some kind of advantage over us."

One Rene MacColl, Washington correspondent for the British Daily Express, is going home, and has celebrated that event with a cheering party against us Americans and our customs.

New France appears back at the Security Council, and says the six principles were wonderful, and should be honored, and wants Egypt to be compelled to negotiate with France and other nations in accordance with them, all except the one that she herself had originally thrown the six principles into the discard.

What has happened instead, and what leaves France unhappy, is that Egypt has accepted the six principles in a declaration of policy formally filed with the United Nations, but that this declaration is unilateral and has not been arrived at in formal negotiation with France and the other nations.

In other words, Egypt has saved that face France desired of destroying by imposing military defeat and military seizure of the Canal. Other nations have accepted Egypt's declaration with the exception of the United States.

The chief significance in his stand is that the argument he uses is one which should be known to all of us.

U.S. Foreign Aid Seen \$58 Billion Since '45

By JAMES MARLOW (AP News Analyst)

Washington, May 20.—The ABC on foreign aid—on how it has been given and how much—background for the nationwide broadcast of President Eisenhower's message on his foreign aid program.

Since the end of World War II, this country has provided almost \$58 billion in foreign aid of all kinds to 80 nations, an average of almost \$2 billion a year over the last 12 years.

Last year Congress voted for this year—\$2,800,000,000. Tonight Eisenhower is expected to ask for next year about \$3,800,000,000.

Explanation and Plan

His talk will be both an explanation of why the money is needed and a plan for public support against the present congressional money-cutting rampage. Congress has cut the aid program "What Eisenhower is doing is what the people want," he said.

Of the \$58 billion spent by this country, far on foreign aid, for the greatest part has been given away, or, as it is called, a grant. Seven billion was given in loans, of which only about \$4 billion has been repaid while \$3 billion has been in grants.

The breakdown on the \$47 billion went for military services and supplies. The remaining \$10 billion was for aid of the humanitarian types—aid for education, health, and other social services.

For example, the Marshall Plan, United States contribution to the United Nations relief and rehabilitation fund, technical assistance, and straight out economic help to aid friendly countries back on their feet.

Now the United States supplies only a minor amount of economic aid to Western Europe. Most of the American help given there now is of the military type.

Aid to the Near East

Economic aid has shifted to southern and southeastern Asia for the Far East, the Middle East. There has also been a step-up in military aid to some nations outside Western Europe.

In the 1956 fiscal year military assistance supplies and services—was \$3 billion worldwide. Of that \$1,800,000,000 went to Western Europe, over \$500 million to Asia and the Pacific, and over \$400 million for the Near East and Africa.

In that same 1956 fiscal year military assistance amounted to \$1.5 billion. But two-thirds of it, \$1 billion, was concentrated in these 12 countries: France, Italy, Turkey, Spain, Brazil, Israel, Iran, Thailand. Most of them also receive military aid.
