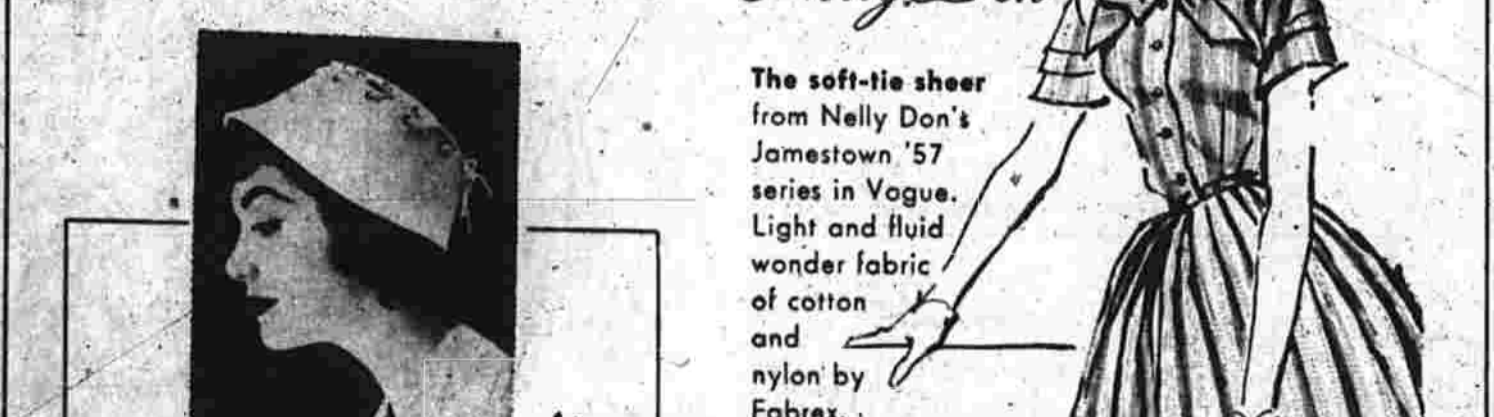

Fantastic Accuracy Built in U.S. Missiles

Lake Success, N.Y., May 25.—A missile hitting a football field from 100 miles away is there a guiding instrument of such accuracy?

At the Sperry Gyroscope plant today, technicians are assembling an amazingly complicated device. It is the brain of the aiming system known as "vertical guidance."

Within the limits imposed by military security, scientists disclosed some information about the device. It is designed to steer a speeding object through the air beneath the sea—straight to a predetermined point.

The most important point—the accuracy of the new systems—is highly classified information. In attempting to describe it, however, Sperry officials said:
