newman from a site 11 miles away.

The rebirth of today's device did not touch the desert floor beneath the disintegrated test tower. This eliminated the great mass of radioactive dirt which in past tests has been sucked into the air.

As a result, the Nevada Test Organization said that fallout in the area surrounding the test site would be minimized.

Because the amount of dust and dirt taken into the air was held to a minimum, test officials said a minimum of radioactive material would be carried outside the test area by winds. Radioactive dust often is carried outside the test area by high-altitude winds but outside the test area actual fallout ordinarily is minor.

As the mushroom cloud lost its shape and drifted lazily over the Nevada wasteland, helicopters buzzed near the landscape taking radioactivity readings. On the ground test personnel moved quickly to to check their instruments.

As usual, the AEC gave no indication of the nature of the device being tested.

46th Shot Since 1951

This was the 46th shot fired from this testing ground since the United States began its series of atomic experiments in 1951.

The AEC was being extremely careful to guard against radioactive fallout dropping on populated areas that had announced that it intended to make this the safest of all test sites as far as fallout was concerned.

This was in the face of widespread public apprehension and worldwide controversy over the effects of fallout.

This series will be the most extensive ever held in Nevada from the standpoint of the number of shots and the period of time covered.

The AEC said: "Each test of this series has been carefully evaluated to determine that it is necessary for the overall objective of strengthening the military and

Coalitions Rule Denmark, Finland

Copenhagen, Denmark, May 28 (AP)—Socialist Premier H. C. Hansen has formed a new coalition cabinet made up of 9 Socialist ministers, 4 Liberals and 3 members of the Single Tax party.

King Frederik IX last week gave Hansen the job of forming another government. Hansen's previous Socialist-Liberal cabinet resigned following parliamentary elections May 14 in which the coalition lost its small majority. Inclusion of the Single Tax party restored the margin necessary for control.

The Socialists have 70 seats in the 179-member Folketing (parliament), 25 more than the second-place Agrarians. The Liberals hold 14 and the Single Tax party, 5.

No major changes in foreign policy were expected in the program the new government will submit to parliament. Hansen will continue to serve as foreign minister as well as premier.

FINNS CRISIS ENDS

Helsinki, Finland, May 28 (AP)—Parliament Speaker V. J. Suksela said he has organized a minority coalition, ending a 3-month Finnish cabinet crisis.

The new government—made up of 7 Agrarians, one Independent and 3 representatives each from the Liberal, Swedish and Finnish Peoples parties—commands 78 of 200 parliament seats.

The Socialist biggest party in Finland, decided not to participate in the non-government but will not oppose it.

The Agrarian-Socialist coalition government of Premier Karl A. Fagerholm submitted its resignation March 11, April 20 and May 22. It was withdrawn the first two times while negotiations went on to find a new government. The resignation followed a split between the coalition partner on an economic stabilization program for Finland.

Estate Appraisal Method Attacked

Hartford, May 28 (AP)—Certain appraisal methods used now in setting the value of estates in probate courts were called "robbing the graves" by a bill to lower appraisal fees by 50 percent introduced today in the House.

The measure had been approved by the Legislature's General Law Committee and passed by the House.

Strong condemnation of current appraisal methods came from Sen. Newman M. Marzulli Jr. (R-Trumbull) during a vain fight to save the legislation.

The rejected bill provided that no appraisal shall be made of that part of an estate consisting of cash on hand or in a bank; federal obligations such as notes and bonds; and stocks, bonds and other securities quoted in recognized markets.

The measure also stated that fees paid to probate court appraisers shall be determined by the "valuation of assets, actually appraised."

Marzulli argued that appraising known assets, such as stocks and bonds, is needless and results in a bigger fee for the appraiser.

"It's robbing the graves," he said. "It's just a racket. Let's get rid of it."

Marzulli contended all that is accomplished by including such assets in the appraisal is to provide "padding money."

Sen. Harry Rowe (R-Bridgewater), denied the charge that the practice was a racket or designed to provide patronage.

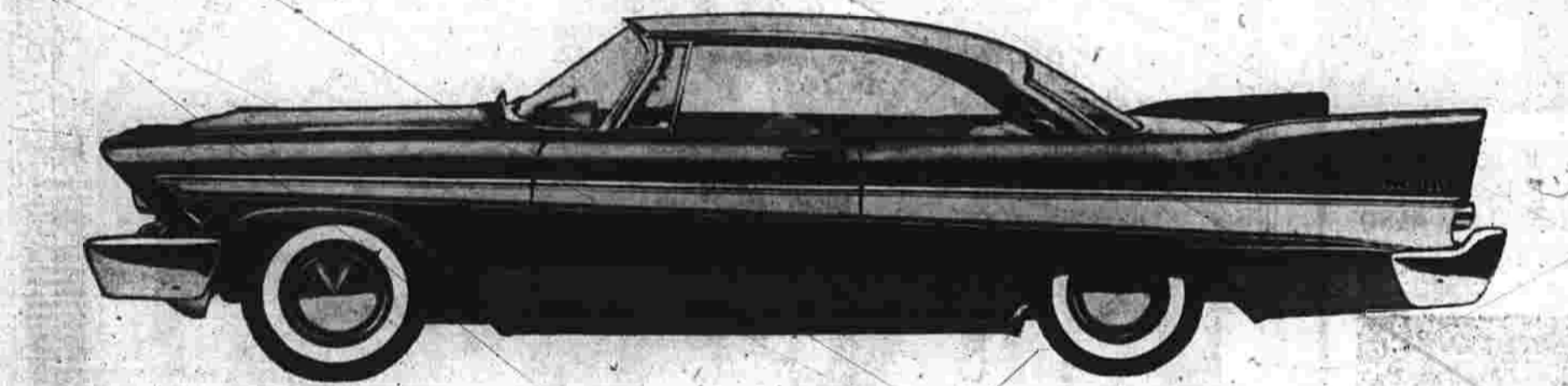

Predictable

The shock of anti-Americanism in Europe, the one place in the world where we were perhaps most sure of our welcome, has been a surprise. But even our forecast, historically.

If we think we have another day in the world, it is the Philippines, to whom we kept our promise of freedom. But we are currently deadlocked with the Philippines in negotiations over our military bases there, and one of the items in the deadlock is over the question of how much American law we can take into the Philippines.

With Japan, to whom we have been the most civilized of victors, there is growing controversy over the presence of American troops in Japan, and over our virtual annexation of the island of Okinawa as an American military base.

Only a revival of fear of Russia, sparked by events in Hungary, kept isolationism carrying through a decision to have us get out of that country.

We are most welcome, perhaps in Britain and West Germany. But no one would deny that the atmosphere of welcome is diminishing in both countries.

All this, we say, could have been forecast, historically. It could have been said 10 years ago and should have been said to themselves at least, by those who were settling down American policy that even we, in our role of defenders of freedom, could expect only a limited time of welcome on the soil of other countries.

It could have been said, then, and should have been said, that our program of establishing American military bases around the world could not aspire to be a permanent program, unless we were prepared to use force to maintain it.

It could and should have been known then that there would have to come a time when we would withdraw from these areas for forward positions we were taking, when we would dismantle the bases we were building on the territory of other nations, when we would take the American uniform out of the lives of other nations.

The time table for all this could have been calculated on two factors, one variable, the other certain. The variable factor is the behavior of Russia. When Russia smiles, other countries feel less need of our military strength, even though that strength may have played a part in bringing Russia to the smile.

Why so many tornadoes? The degree of our welcome on foreign soils is variable, in the region of the way Russia is acting.

But the degree of our welcome moves steadily in one direction in simple response to the simple factor of the time involved. The desire to have us get out mounts day by day, week by week, year by year, in any country we could name, not because we are particularly objectionable, but because our behavior is particularly bad, but simply because we are outsiders, on the soil of another country.

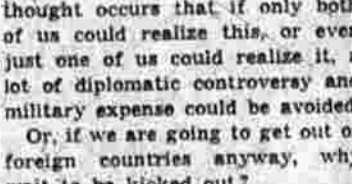
Given any measure of Russian behavior, it is time factor alone that take us out of all our foreign bases all over the world.

Nor will this be because we are especially civilized and sensitive to the wishes of other peoples. This is the same thing is also going to happen, inevitably, to Russia, in its own much more limited but more intense military penetration of other countries in the cold war era.

Russia is going to have to get out of Hungary as inevitably as we are going to have to get out of Okinawa. And if there is anything that is certain in this world, it is that both of us are going to have to get out of Germany.

Yet when Russia suggests that we abandon our system of overseas bases, we treat that as an impossible impertinence, and when

'Clean' Hydrogen Bomb Major Objective of AEC

up to data a similar booklet issued in 1950 on the effects of atomic weapons. The 1950 booklet was written before the development of the hydrogen bomb.

The new booklet was said to contain the most detailed exposition yet made by the Defense Department on the damage that could be expected in a nuclear war in which hydrogen bombs were used.

The subcommittee recalled its stand today Dr. W. W. Kellogg of the Rand Corp., which predicts fallout patterns under contract with the AEC.

Kellogg told the subcommittee yesterday such predictions require information from the Weather Bureau about wind speeds and directions at various heights, so that the probable path of atomic particles can be traced from the explosion cloud down to the ground.

Next in line to testify was Dr.

of Dr. Enrico Fermi and his associates at the University of Chicago in producing the chain reaction which led to the A-bomb and later to peaceful uses of atomic fission.

"So you could assume there would be a 14-year delay in development of fusion as compared with fission energy if the difficulties are comparable," Mills went on. "But it could add another five years because actually the difficulties are greater — or say about 20 years in all."

Mills said scientists now estimate atomic power from fusion may be used to produce electricity commercially at prices competing with conventional power in the 1970s. Twenty years later, would mean fusion power perhaps in the 1990s, he continued, but he expects

a slow down because atomic power will by then be available and the incentive to find new power sources will be reduced.

As for fuel, Mills said sea water contains a small proportion of deuterium, the "heavy hydrogen" needed for the hydrogen fusion reaction. Because of their deuterium content, he said, the oceans contain potentially 200 times as much energy as if they are composed of fuel oil instead of water—but first the secret of controlling fusion must be mastered.

Now is the question: What agency is most suited to provide this specialized type of air transport for the Army? It must be noted that the Army has operated with outstanding success in combat, using this specialized type of light aircraft in order to attack its front. Three Acquitted In Montesi Case

Venice, Italy, May 28 (AP)—A 3-judge court today returned its formal verdict acquitting all three top defendants of complicity in the death of pretty Wilma Montesi.

The decision ended a 3-month trial that slumped in its anticlimax last week when State Prosecutor Cesare Palminteri told the court the prosecution's chief witness had lied repeatedly.

Palminteri said no proof had been developed against any of the three accused.

The trial started in a blaze of publicity with rumors of dope and sex intrigues in high social circles and of influence wielding by leading officials. The body of the 20-year-old girl was found on a beach near Rome three years ago.

Acquitted were Gianpiero Piccioni, 35-year-old jazz pianist, who was accused of manslaughter by allegedly abandoning Wilma's body on the deserted beach; Ugo Montagna, Rome playboy and serially married man; and Severino Polito, former Rome police chief. Montagna and Polito were accused of trying to cover up for Piccioni.

Polito was forced to resign his police post. Piccioni's father, former Foreign Minister Attilio Piccioni, quit his cabinet job at the height of the uproar over the case.

For a time the government was in danger.

Also winning acquittal were eight other lesser defendants, all accused of giving false testimony.

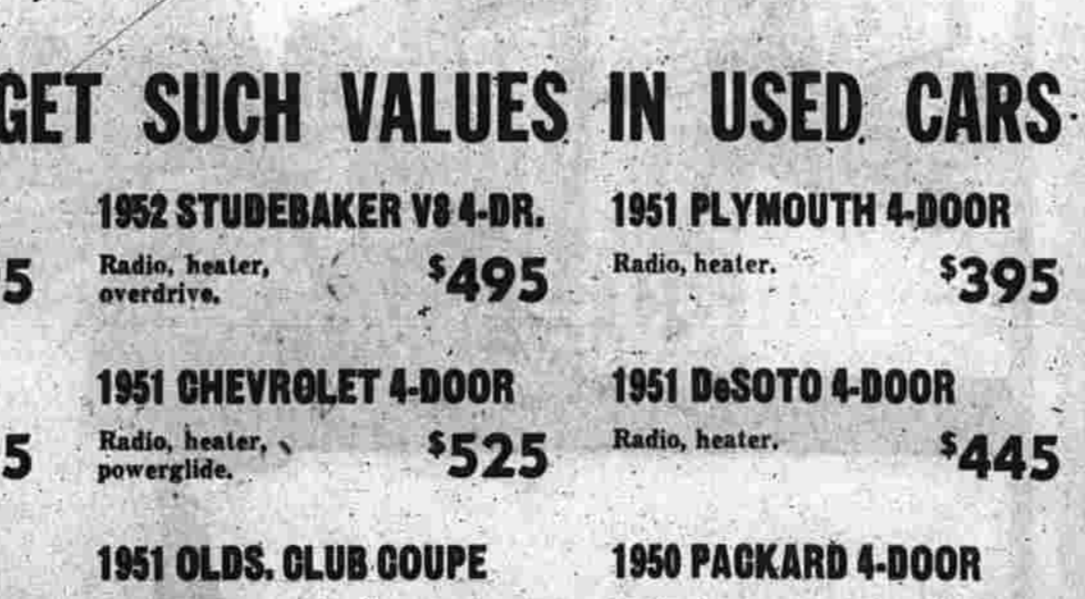

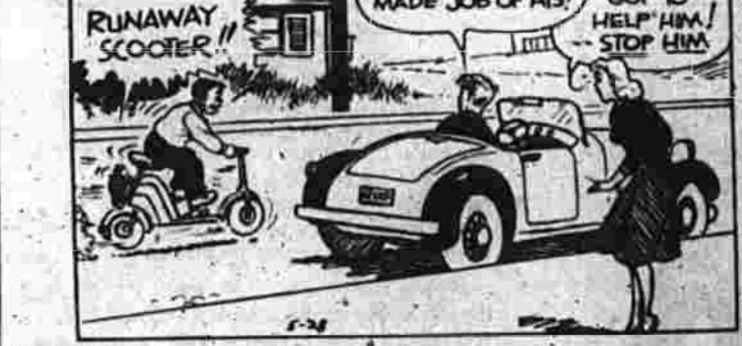
