Bahrain won at 5-4 odds in 1953. Crepello, a Chestnut colt, was given a beautiful ride by jockey Lester Piggott to enable England to break the French hold on this ancient race. French owners won the race in 1955 and 1956.

Crepello, the best betting choice ever since he won the 2,000 Guineas race in convincing fashion, secured by a length and a half, in front of Pipe of Peace.

A crowd of approximately 200,000, including the entire royal family with the exception of the Duke of Edinburgh who is in London, saw Crepello come charging from behind to win.

Rockville-Vernon Selectmen Offer City Peerless Mill Share

Rockville, June 5 (Special)—The Board of Selectmen went on record today as being agreeable to turning the town's share of the Peerless Mill property over to the City for negotiations toward establishing a shopping center.

First Selectman Herbert A. Pagan said the announcement today and said a town meeting will be called for a week from today to place the matter in the hands of the town's voters. A petition to that effect was presented to the selectmen by Mayor Herman G. Olson last night.

All World Benefits
Signed by about 50 taxpayers, the petition points out that the proposed shopping center would benefit the whole town, as well as the city, and requests that the selectmen be empowered to convey Peerless Mill to the city by Quitclaim deed.

It is included on the agenda of the town meeting, Pagan said, will be authorization to hold a special session for making voters on June 22 and July 20 from 9 a. m. to 8 p. m. According to state statutes, regular sessions will be held August 24 and September 14 during the same hours.

The town meeting is being called for Wednesday, the earliest possible date, to avoid conflict with the annual city meeting scheduled for Tuesday.

Mayor's Views
In presenting his views on the shopping center project Mayor Olson said it could be built on the site of the Peerless Mill building, the development of the two adjacent parcels of land would provide greater benefits to both municipalities.

The mayor said the Peerless property is about one-fifth of the total area involved and hence the town owns only half the Peerless property. Its share of the entire project would be one-tenth.

He also pointed out that Peerless property involves the greatest expense to the developer, who must dig down the mill and construct a river which runs beside it. The recreation field is clear and level. The developer has offered to build a \$75,000 city hall for the city, and to build a half-million dollar shopping center, in exchange for the tax revenue from the proposed project is estimated at \$14,000 for the town and \$7,000 for the city.

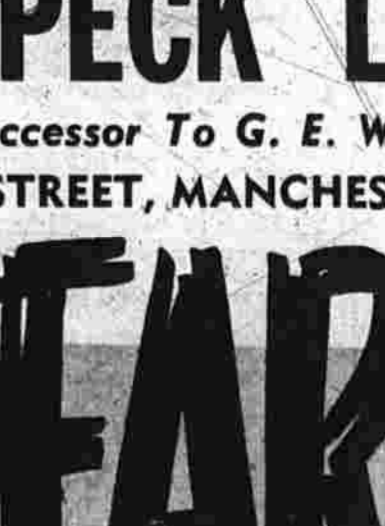
