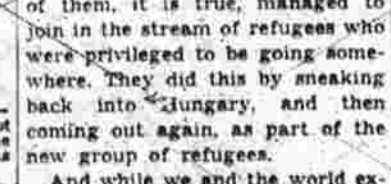

He said a member of the staff of the New York Times, said he had informed his parents by telephone about the decision to name the baby, born early Wednesday at Doctors Hospital. The paternal grandparents are coming here later to see the child.

Truman has said he did not want the child named entirely after him—because it would be a handicap.

# U.S. Signs Aid Treaty With Communist Poles

Richard director general of Poland's Ministry of Finance.

In its firm commitment today, the United States pledged a \$30 million export-import bank loan to Poland and an allocation of \$18,000,000 to finance the sale of cotton and fats and oils to Poland for Poland's needs.

The \$30 million loan is to be used to purchase agricultural products and about \$4 million worth of machinery to help modernize the production of Polish foodstuffs which goes to western Europe.

**Loan for 20 Years**

The loan will be repaid in 20 years, the announcement said, will be repayable in dollars at 4 1/2 per cent interest with payments beginning in 1961 and continuing over 20 years.

Among the agricultural products which Poland is to get under the first half of the total program are 100,000 metric tons of wheat, 25,000 metric tons of cotton, 60,000 metric tons of soybeans and 17,500 metric tons of fats and oils.

It was estimated that the cost of these goods in the United States will amount to about \$47,000,000, a sum which is covered in the \$48,000,000 loan.

Under the second half of the program, which is to be signed if and when Congress acts, the United States would provide for 400,000 metric tons of wheat, 100,000 metric tons of cotton and 100,000 metric tons of soybeans.

The announcement said, Polish slabs received by the United States in return for surplus agricultural products will be sold at the rate of 25 to 50 per cent above the prevailing rate of exchange.

The slabs will be available for American use such as the expenses of the embassy in Warsaw. After five years the Polish government is to repurchase for dollars such slabs as the United States does not use.

Under the first half agreement signed today Poland would pay cash at a rate up to \$72,000,000 a year, when the whole \$50 million program is completed, the repurchase rate would be increased to 25 1/2 per cent.

"The Polish government," the announcement said, "has expressed the desire to make additional purchases of agricultural and other commodities from the United States under credit or local currency sales arrangements. The United States will continue to study these proposals and to discuss with the Polish government with respect to them a mutually convenient date."

Kennedy's figure showed that out of about \$80,000 receipts, some \$60,000 went to Krausstein. This included about \$48,000 cash, a portrait of Krausstein and a gift for public use.

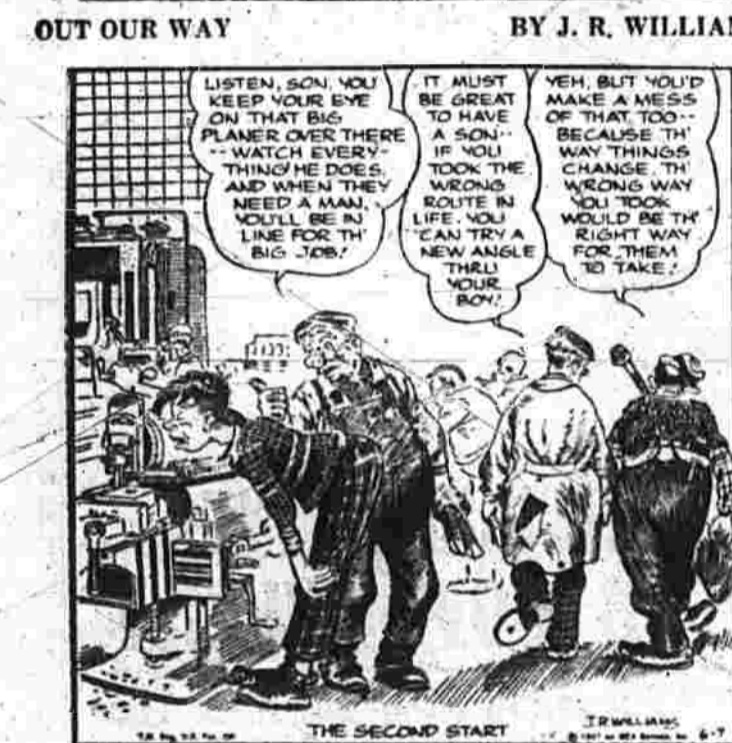

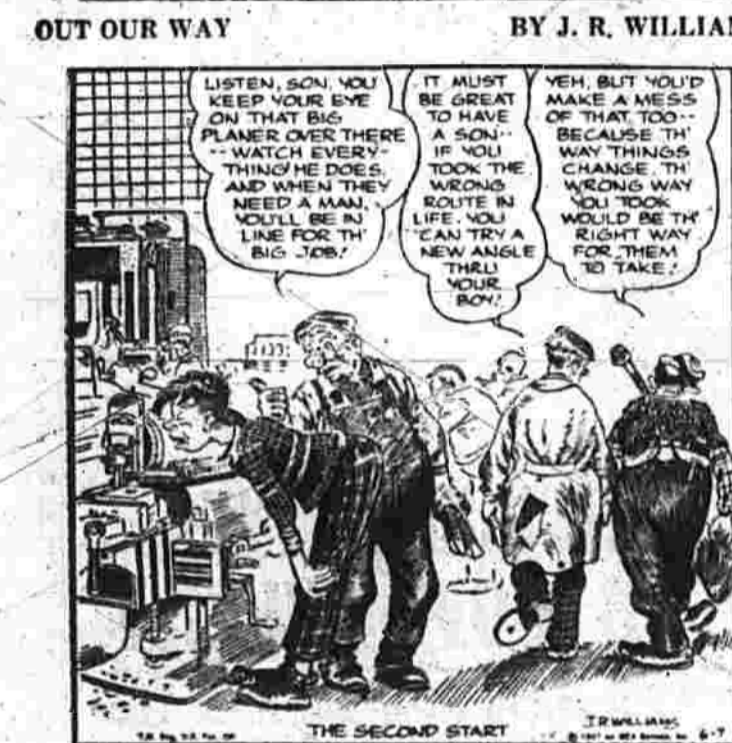

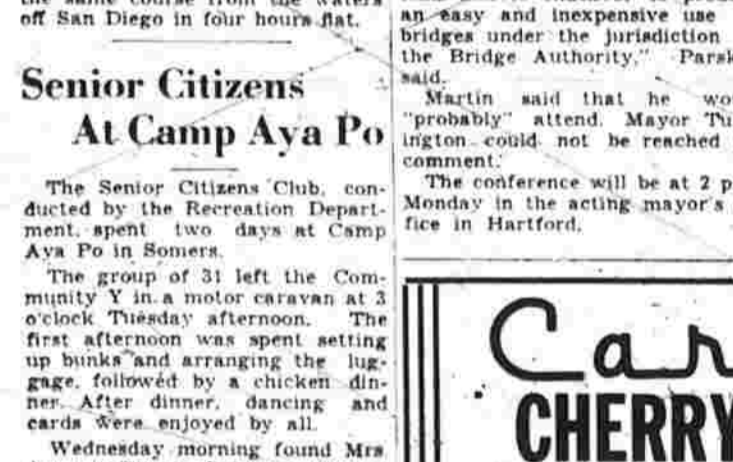
