Hagerty said the report he put out came from Col. Thomas W. Mattingly, heart specialist at the Army's Walter Reed Hospital; Maj. Gen. Leonard Heaton, Walter Reed commandant, and Maj. Gen. Howard M. Snyder, Eisenhower's personal physician.

Eisenhower was stricken about 10 o'clock last night, and was nauseated and vomiting during part of the night. Snyder was called in shortly after the President became ill and remained with him all night. The other physicians were called in today for consulta-
