Judge Rules in Favor Of Army in Nike Case

U.S. Judge J. Joseph Smith has ruled in favor of the government in its condemnation of Lakewood Circle land for a Nike housing site.

In a memorandum filed yesterday, Judge Smith rejected the arguments advanced by Lakewood Circle attorneys to block construction of the housing, and denied their motion to raise a Constitutional issue.

The effect of the ruling is to waive out the last hurdle to the government's right to construct the housing—unless the residents decide to appeal to a higher court. There was no indication today as to whether Judge Smith's decision would be appealed. Lakewood Circle residents said they would have to discuss the matter with their attorneys before making a decision. They have 60 days from the date of the memorandum to file a notice of appeal.

Judge Smith's ruling came with unexpected swiftness. It was filed only one day after attorneys for the government and Lakewood Circle argued their cases in Federal Court in Hartford. However, briefs had been filed several weeks earlier.

Grants Dismissal Motion

In his memorandum, Judge Smith granted the government's motion to dismiss the Lakewood Circle residents' answer to the condemnation action. He also denied the residents' motion to amend that answer so that they could raise some Constitutional questions.

The government's action in condemning the land was contested by only four Lakewood Circle residents, whose land was directly involved. However, they were acting in behalf of a number of their neighbors who have been battling the government on the issue for months. All but a small strip of the 13 acres taken was actually here.

Attorney for Lakewood Circle, in their original answer to the government's taking order, maintained that the condemnation was "arbitrary" and without authority. They held that since the Statute authorizing the Secretary of the Army to acquire land for family housing sites did not mention Manchester, he was barred from acting here.

They also held that there was other land equally available for the housing site, whose taking would not affect choice residential property, such as the Residence AA, Lakewood Circle area. The asserted complaint of residents of that area has been their property values would suffer as a result of the proximity of the 12 houses the Army wants to erect.

taught musician, forced brass band instruments into the reluctant hands of Jimmy and his younger brother Tommy before they were old enough for the three R's.

Jimmy was the quiet, cautious one. Tommy, the hot-tempered extrovert. Typically, Jimmy mastered the woodwinds and chose the clarinet—the jazzman's "license plate"—for his favorite instrument. Tommy went for brass, and the hardest brass there is, the trombone.

They started playing together in 1923 in small bands and gradually worked their way up the ladder to jobs with the Paul Whiteman and Vincent Lopez bands.

Tommy kept insisting they form their own band, and Jimmy finally gave in. The Dorsey Brothers Orchestra was a scorching success, employing such stars as Glenn Miller, Charlie Spivak, Ray McKinley and Bob Crosby. It broke apart in 1935 in a flareup over tempo. Tommy walked out, and started his own struggling band. Jimmy went to Hollywood to conduct for Bing Crosby.

Both were famous jazz musicians for nearly three decades; each had his own style and musical personality. Tommy was "The Swingin' Gentleman of Swing."

Jimmy was a more reserved, box set. Together they sold more than 10 million records.

Jimmy was divorced in 1949 by his wife of 21 years, Jane. She complained he wouldn't let anyone else's records in the house, but sat up at all hours playing his own as much as 100 times. They had one daughter, Mrs. Julie Hilton of Hollywood.

Nadin Pleads Manslaughter in Gas Death

Bridgeport, June 12 (AP)—George W. Nadin, 39, yesterday pleaded guilty to manslaughter in the death of his wife, Mary, 36, who was killed Dec. 14 when a gas explosion destroyed the Nadin home in Norwalk.

Previously he had been charged with first degree murder.

Superior Court Judge John P. Cotter continued the case for a penitentiary investigation.

Asst. State's Atty. Otto J. Bauer, in the absence of State's Atty. Lewis W. Willis, told Judge Cotter that the change in plea was acceptable to the state with an exception: public defender John F. McGowan said he and Mr. Willis had had numerous conferences about the case, and in view of all the facts and circumstances, the state was willing to accept a plea of manslaughter.

He informed the court that even at an early age Nadin was subject to fits and seizures, and when he was in the Navy during World War II he sometimes lapsed into a state of psychotic reaction and delirium.

During per-trial investigation, Norwalk police said Nadin had been dependent about finances and planned to kill his wife and their son, George Jr., 12, and Glenn, 8, by illuminating gas.

He was indicted for first degree murder by a grand jury on Feb. 21.

NHRR Seeks Fares Hike

Boston, June 12 (AP)—New England Railroad officials yesterday asked approval of their plan to raise the fares for multiple ride tickets from 3 to 12 cents a trip.

Charles E. Williams, general passenger traffic manager, told a Public Utilities Board hearing the increase would be 5 per cent on 10 ride tickets to stations outside the 15 mile zone from Boston.

The road also asked hikes of 15 cents to 117 cents a ride on 12 ride tickets for use within the 15 mile zone.

Williams said the fares on these multiple ride tickets have remained unchanged since 1950.

He said the road's annual income from these tickets now is \$219,000 from the 10 ride tickets, and the increase would amount to \$23,000 a year, he said.

Williams said increased wages and other costs led the road to ask for the increases.
