Hal Boyle Will Science Invent Foolproof Human?

New York (AP)—Sidewalk acrobats by a pavement plate.

Looking into the future is one of mankind's oldest games.

This pleasant age-old pastime has an awesome quality today, however. For peering into the future, is no longer mere guesswork as it was in the past, when most of the seers were obvious quacks or parlor entertainers.

The forecasters today are generally scientists, and presumably their pictures of the future are painted with facts rather than conjectures.

Not long ago Dr. W. R. G. Baker, a vice president of General Electric, prophesied that 50 years from now we would be controlled by such marvels as electronic automobiles, automatically controlled airplane traffic and telephone televisions, which would allow people conducting a telephone conversation to see as well as hear each other.

This last-named mechanical marvel, a dubious blessing if ever we have heard of one, has already

reached a practicable stage. But except for people calling long distance on Mother's Day, who really years to see the other over the telephone? Only teenagers. The rest of us appreciate the telephone's value as an instrument that enables to be heard and yet remain unseen.

In his predictions Dr. Baker speculated that in the closing years of this century a long hunger for material well-being may well be tempered by an increasing concern for spiritual satisfaction.

Unfortunately of this there is no guarantee. Barring an atomic world war in which the entire human race might be offered up on a hydrogen-heated blueplate as a sacrifice to the Gods of Battle, it is certain that science will develop many gadgets to make our life more efficient, hurried and insecure. But there is no certainty that it will make our way of life happier or satisfying.

The prospect is that the brave new toys of the future will make

us more dependent upon each other—not more self-reliant as individuals. We may not be our brother's keeper, but each of us will surely be one another's crutch. And the question of whether the machine serves man or man has become the slave of the machine will grow more pressing.

The mechanisms that spring from man's agile mind multiply with the speeding years to bring him more and more creature comforts. But the mechanism of man's heart remains largely untouched and unimproved.

The man of the future may well dwell in a plastic home heated by solar energy and surrounded by plastic grass that never needs to be cut by a lawnmower. But unless he himself can be powered out of plastic, how well will he fit in this plastic world a-coming?

It is pleasant to know that foods can be made to last longer if irradiated. But what about the irradiated man? Will he last longer, too?

We live already in an homogenized world in which our clothing is half-synthetic—and our pleasures even more so. Some days don't you wake up with a feeling it would be helpful if you were part-deacon, so you'd be more durable?

The undone task of science is to find, not water formulae to improve the world outside the heart, but techniques to improve the world inside the heart. When will

science come up with a foolproof human being?

Until it does the great danger of the future, as it has always been in the past, and is in the present, will be that man, pursuing his old dreams, will be destroyed by his equally ancient nightmares.

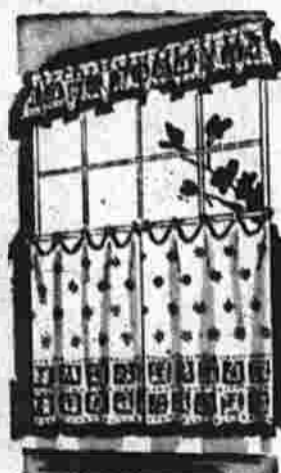

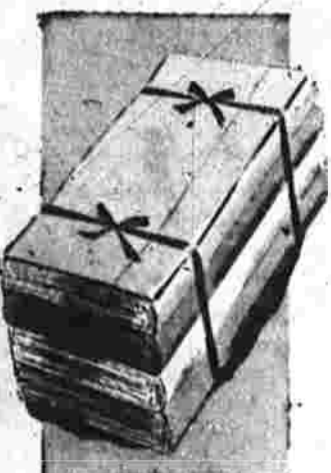

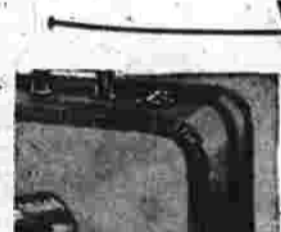

She appears to be well equipped to handle the job, having a B.S. de- gree in education from State Teachers College, Framingham, Mass., and a Master's degree in Education from Cornell Univer- sity.

Before coming to Tolland Coun- ty she taught home economics in Topsheld, Mass., and was a 4-H Club Agent in Kennebec County, Maine.

As Home Demonstration Agent in this county she has helped women with all phases of home- making, including family life.

The county home-making pro- gram is carried on by the Tolland County Extension Council under joint sponsorship of the University of Connecticut and the U.S. De- partment of Agriculture.

Such phases of home life as in- terior decoration, sewing, nutri- tion, food preservation and money management, are taught to women in the county by the home-making agent.

In the middle 1940's Miss Webb conducted an extensive survey of health and sanitary conditions in the county. She found outside toilet facilities of many schools were un- improved, well water had not been tested and, in some communities, there was only one doctor.

Her report resulted in the test- ing of all well water used in schools and in the screening of outside fa- cilities. Since that time most com- munities have had to build new schools because of increased en- rollment and have provided modern plumbing.

The State Medical Assn. after hearing a report of her work con- ducted a similar survey through- out the state in order that they might advise young doctors which communities were in need of their services.

Glastonbury School Plans Under Study

Glastonbury, June 19 (Special)—Modified plans for the construction of the proposed elementary school on Hebron Ave., are being prepared to reduce overall cost and should be ready within the week.

Architectural plans for the original specifications were rejected by the Public Building Committee (PBC), Chairman Martin L. Rorer said the bids ranged in price from \$412,000 to \$586,000. The Committee felt that with further study, small changes could be made without affecting either the design or size of the building, but which would help lower the cost.

Some substitution in materials could be made and a redesigned driveway approach would cut paving cost. Placing the school building back on the property would bring it nearer the water supply main and the self-draining catch basins could be used. A rare Javanese gamelan orchestra of miniature musicians and instruments is now on exhibit to the Whiton Memorial Library, lent by its owner, Mrs. Kathryn Hawthorne of Elm Hill Rd., Palmdale, Calif. Mrs. Hawthorne acquired the collection of fragile, painted clay musicians and wooden gongs, keyed instruments, drums and cymbals during her 10 years as a missionary in Sumatra, second largest island of Indonesia. For four of those years she was interested in the art of making the tiny figures and instruments seem to be alive.

There are various types of gamelan orchestras, Mrs. Hawthorne explained, some composed of adult males and others of young boys, some for festivals, for shadowplays where traditional figures are used, and for ancient dances performed by elaborately gowned figures. At a festival celebrating a marriage or some other gala occasion, the gamelan will play for three days and nights with the 15 or so musicians grouped around the house that is the focus of the event. Mrs. Hawthorne said, "Everybody is very happy, I must confess, though," she added, "that I never learned to enjoy the music. The sound of the enormous gongs is very loud and the rhythm or pattern of the music entirely different from what we've used. There were times when I preferred the jungle to the gamelan." The exhibit, guaranteed to be very quiet, will remain in the Whiton Memorial Library for an indefinite period this summer.
