**Sheinwold on Bridge**

DECLARER HAS ADVANTAGE IN MOST BRIDGE HANDS. By Alfred Sheinwold

One good reason for bidding aggressively is that you make some "impossible" contract. The declarer has the advantage of knowing what he has to do with the defenders must work out some guessing. The difference shows up in today's hand.

West opened the jack of hearts, and South wisely played low from dummy. It was now up to East to make a key decision.

He considered overruling with the queen of hearts in order to return the jack of diamonds. This would defeat the contract, but there was no way for East to know what the situation was. If South had a different kind of hand, it might be vital for the defense to get their heart tricks first and worry about the diamonds later.

West led another heart, and South ruffed. Declarer drew two rounds of trumps and ran the four clubs to discard a diamond from dummy. This limited the defense to two diamonds and their one heart trick.

Daily Question  
Partner deals and bids one no-trump, and the next player (declarer) bids: Spades K 10 7 3, Hearts Q 10 4, Diamonds C 8 5 2, Clubs K 2. What do you say?

Answer: Bid two clubs. If your partner is a good player, this is the Stayman Convention. Your bid does not show clubs, but asks your partner to show a biddable major suit if he has one. If he has one, bid it.

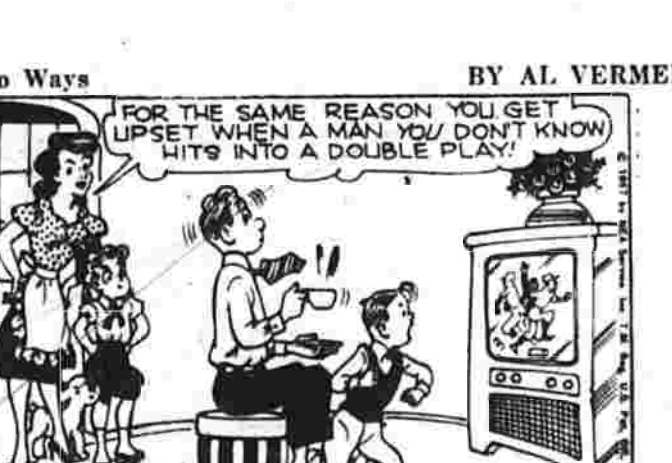
