Red Bloc Stronger, U.S. Losing: Chou

He promised that local authorities will soon be given a chance to exercise their initiative under leadership of the party-controlled national congress.

"Some Rightists are now attacking the basic system of the state on the pretext of helping the Communist party improve its working style," he said. "Their main aim is to seize state power from the working class and its vanguard Communist party."

"They aim to take the country from a course of socialism to a Capitalist course. The Chinese people will not tolerate this."

"The Communist counter-revolutionary forces still stand by awaiting action as U.S. Imperialists and Chinese Nationalists are still staging armed provocations and sending in agents."

Chou told the gathering Red China "will continue to treat seriously from the Soviet Union and all other Socialist (Communist) countries."

"We must continue our efforts and criticize and overcome doctrinaire methods of learning," he said.

"We must also refute the revisionist view of Rightists that universal truths of Marxism and advanced experience of the Soviet Union should all be repudiated as mere dogma."

Cancer Drive Exceeds Goal

The annual meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Manchester Division of the American Cancer Society was held last night at the home of Dr. E. L. Besser.

It was reported by Frank Simon, drive chairman, and Mrs. Charles Albert, chairman of volunteers, that funds collected in the recent campaign had surpassed the quota set for the Manchester area. A total of \$15,235.78 had been received.

Chou asserted that America's major allies were "tending to get rid of American control, both economically and politically, and to consolidate and develop mutual contacts with the socialist countries."

"Quite possibly the new, more deceptive American colonialist intrigues could have a temporary success in dumping down the struggle for national independence in some countries, such as Jordan, by taking advantage of the people's lack of experience."

Chou said the national independence movement, like any other people's movement, could not be suppressed.

"In this long-term complicated struggle, each setback serves to educate the people and to help them find the path of victory," he asserted.

"The danger of war still exists, but it is possible for us to bring about a further relaxation of the international situation and force the imperialist war to accept the principle of peaceful coexistence, provided we can unite with all possible forces internationally and persist in our struggle."

"This is because the Socialist camp has become more powerful and united, the ranks of the peace-loving countries and people are constantly expanding, the demand of the American people for peace is growing, and the U.S. aggressive clique is finding itself more and more isolated."

Postal money orders issued in 1956 amounted to \$2,911,182,000, more than double the amount produced in China in 48 years prior to Communist control of the mainland.

The Red Premier went out of his way to deny suggestions that differences existed in the Communist bloc as a result of the Soviet repression of the Hungarian revolt.

"The unity of the camp of socialism (communism)," he declared, "was strengthened, not weakened, after the Hungarian revolt."

"The facts have proved that international Socialist unity, based on proletarian internationalism and equality, cannot be destroyed by provocations."

Chou credited Russia with helping ease international tension in the past year and praised the "series of reasonable proposals put forward by the Soviet Union on arms reduction, banning of weapons of mass destruction and nuclear weapon tests, abolition of military bases and withdrawal of armed forces from foreign lands."

Other factors which helped ease tension, Chou said, were: (1) the Soviet Union's call for a big-power conference on the Middle East (which the West rejected), (2) the increasingly important role in safeguarding world peace being played by such Asian and African nations as India, Burma, Ceylon, Egypt and Syria, and (3) the increasing unity of the Communist bloc.

The Communist leader asserted that in "practically all U.S.-controlled countries" a demand was mounting to get rid of American authority, add a policy of peace and neutrality and oppose "aggressive military blocs."

"Especially noticeable," he said,

torium, school of the words of the hymn in hearty song. Symbolic of Christian worship—a cross, the Bible, a communion table and a chalice—were presented on the stage, one by one, amid singing.

The occasion climaxed 17 painstaking, sometimes tedious years of negotiations, delayed for one year by a lawsuit. President Bushower, in his message, said "Our two historic traditions have made a splendid contribution to the faith and work of the nation and to lands across the sea."

Congregational Christians, whose spiritual ancestors were the Puritans who came to this country on the Mayflower 350 years ago, developed their church from British Protestantism. They emphasize the freedom of each individual congregation.

The Evangelical and Reformed Church, whose progenitors came to this country in the early 1700's from the Swiss and German Reformation movements. Their church governing structure is more regulated.

To effect the bond between these two forms of government—known generally in Protestantism as "free church" and "Presbyterian" policy—the union agreement allows each church to determine its own "voluntary relationship" to denominational agencies.

It is the bringing together of groups from these two general classifications that makes the merger a milestone in the annals of Protestant unity efforts.

Representatives of 30 other denominations, some of whom have indicated they eventually seek to join the newly united Church, attended the ceremony.

An agreement called a "Basis of Union," to regulate the affairs by two-thirds of the Congregational Christian Church of the 44 E. & H. regional synods.

The interim document corresponds roughly to the Articles of Confederation that served this nation from the time of its infancy until the U.S. Constitution was written and approved.

Minority still opposed. A minority of Congregational Christian Churches still is opposing the merger. Four of them have a new legal challenge pending in federal court in New York.

Marine Corps Maj. Gen. Homer L. Litzberg, replied that the questions raised by Chung were "not proper subjects to be discussed at a military conference, therefore they are rejected."

Litzberg added that the governments making up the U.N. Command tried to work out a peaceful and just settlement of the Korean problem at the Geneva conference in line with the U.N. objective in Korea.

"The governments of the U.N. command remain ready to discuss withdrawal of forces and unification on the basis of U.N. objectives," the U.N. spokesman said.

"I shall your side to prepare to settle the Korean question on these just objectives," he added, "any political conference would only result in a deadlock because of Communist intransigence."

The chief U.N. objective is the holding of free elections in both halves of the peninsula under U.N. supervision.

Litzberg said the U.N. command was forced to scrap the armistice clause banning atomic weapons because Communist actions had left the armistice agreement "in default." As an example, he said nine Communist jet planes "illegally introduced" into North Korea "flew over Allied air territory June 24 and continued that incident further illustrates the death" of the Reds on the armistice ban.

The exchange between the U.N. and Communist officials took place across a narrow table in a hotly stuffy building in this town.

Chung spoke for 15 minutes in Korean. After his statement was translated into Chinese and English, Litzberg made his reply.

Chung asserted that all the people of Korea want foreign troops withdrawn, but instead of pulling out, he said, America is trying to turn South Korea into "an eternal colony" and an advance base for "atomic war."

He said the shift of the U.N. Command from Tokyo to Seoul scheduled for July 1, is part of a series of actions in preparation for a new war.

"If you believe our side introduced weapons in violation of the armistice, why did you not ask the neutral nations supervisory commission to investigate?" Chung asked.

He made no direct reference, however, to possible resumption of
