

McKain, head of the department of Rural Sociology at the University of Connecticut.

Dr. McKain has recently completed a survey of the effect of suburbanization upon retail trade in the Hartford metropolitan area.

"The volume of business being transacted in Manchester and the smount of individual spending here has shown that Manchester residents are acquiring buying habits within this area rather than patronizing Hartford merchants,"

Sales tax figures show that taxable sales in Manchester amounted to \$36,688,046 for 1956.

A report from the office of State Tax Commissioner John L. Sullivan shows that taxable sales have increased by \$4,460,410 from last year's figure of \$32,227,636.

The largest of the several specific categories under taxable sales was the automotive group, which accounted for \$8,327,967 for 1956.

This is, however, lower than the 1955 figure of \$9,102,798.






