There is a very great health problem because of the bodies of both human beings and animals. All of the health agencies are working very hard.

Thousands of old rubber tires were collected yesterday in four human gyms for animals whose bodies were piled up with them by bulldozers.

A feverish 24-hour "open" operation for scavengers of the season first burrowed gave way to a grim quest for the dead. State forces 14 to the south was finally opened from here.
