Rose-Colored History

Secretary of State Dulles has, among other things, a rose-colored history. Discussing our position in the American press conference the other day, he said the following:

"There were quite a few of our allies that wanted the United States to annex Oklahoma outright at the time of the conference. I assuredly gave answer at that point. They wanted to see it planted there without the possibility of any other kind of a settlement. I said that of that opinion and of the other options, however, we had decided that the best solution was to leave the residual sovereignty in Japan, but to give the United States the rights of control and administration for as long as it was appropriate."

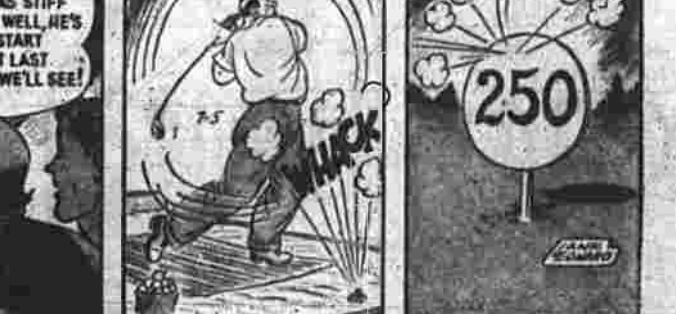
