(Continued from Page One) Grand speech made public today that Malenkov 'persistently endeavored to force me to sign a forgery.'

When all Malenkov's efforts failed, Turko said, 'it was threatened and accused of every mortal sin.'

'Everything the Central Committee said about him and his character was correct from beginning to end,' Turko said.

Turko charged Malenkov, former Foreign Minister, V. M. Molotov and Lennin Kaganovich, former member of the Soviet Union's ruling party, Presidium, were 'fierce enemies who used the old methods of the party.'

'This was particularly inappropriate because for these same people I have been talking about the unity of the party and the necessity of the party,' Turko said.

'In February 1949 I myself got to the style and methods of Malenkov's work among members of the party.'
