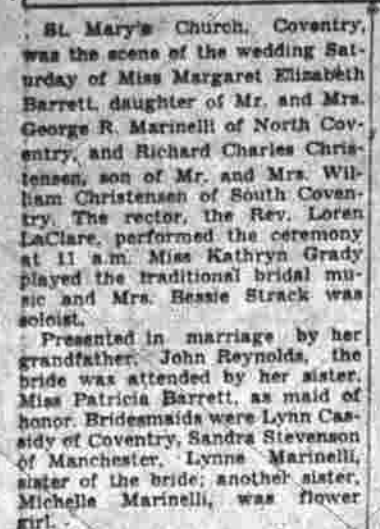

Motion Sickness Can Be Avoided Chicago—According to a Minneapolis doctor writing in the American Medical Association's magazine, Today's Health, you don't have to worry any more about that old vacation bogey, motion sickness. Under most circumstances, he says, motion sickness can be ward off, and even when preventive measures fail, drugs are available to give relief. Motion sickness results from "too much nerve-tickling action" in the ear's labyrinth, the organ that helps a person keep his balance, the article says. Keeping the head steady reduces this action, the doctor advises, and the head can be steadied by leaning it against a backrest, bracing it in position with pillows, or by focusing the eyes on the horizon.

Vacationist Does Repairs at Home St. Louis—A recent survey of how many Americans spent part of their vacations on home-improvement projects shows: Sixty-eight per cent spent all or part of their vacation at home; 81 per cent of them devoted their time to workshop or home-improvement projects. Of those projects—which included yard maintenance, house repairs, garden and yard care—some 60 to 70 per cent represented painting and decorating projects.

Indonesia Lands Heavily Forested

Jakarta—Forests cover some 240,000 acres of Indonesia, about two thirds of the country's land area. Of this forested area 74 per cent is in Kalimantan, (Borneo) and East Indonesia, 24 per cent in Sumatra, and 2 per cent in Java and Madura. Vast areas of virgin forest are one of Indonesia's principal unexploited resources. The most important exports obtained from the forests are spices, kapok, rattan, resin, camphor, and tanning bark. Ropes, leatherwood and construction lumber are also exported. Most of the forests are of mixed species, which makes logging operations costly.

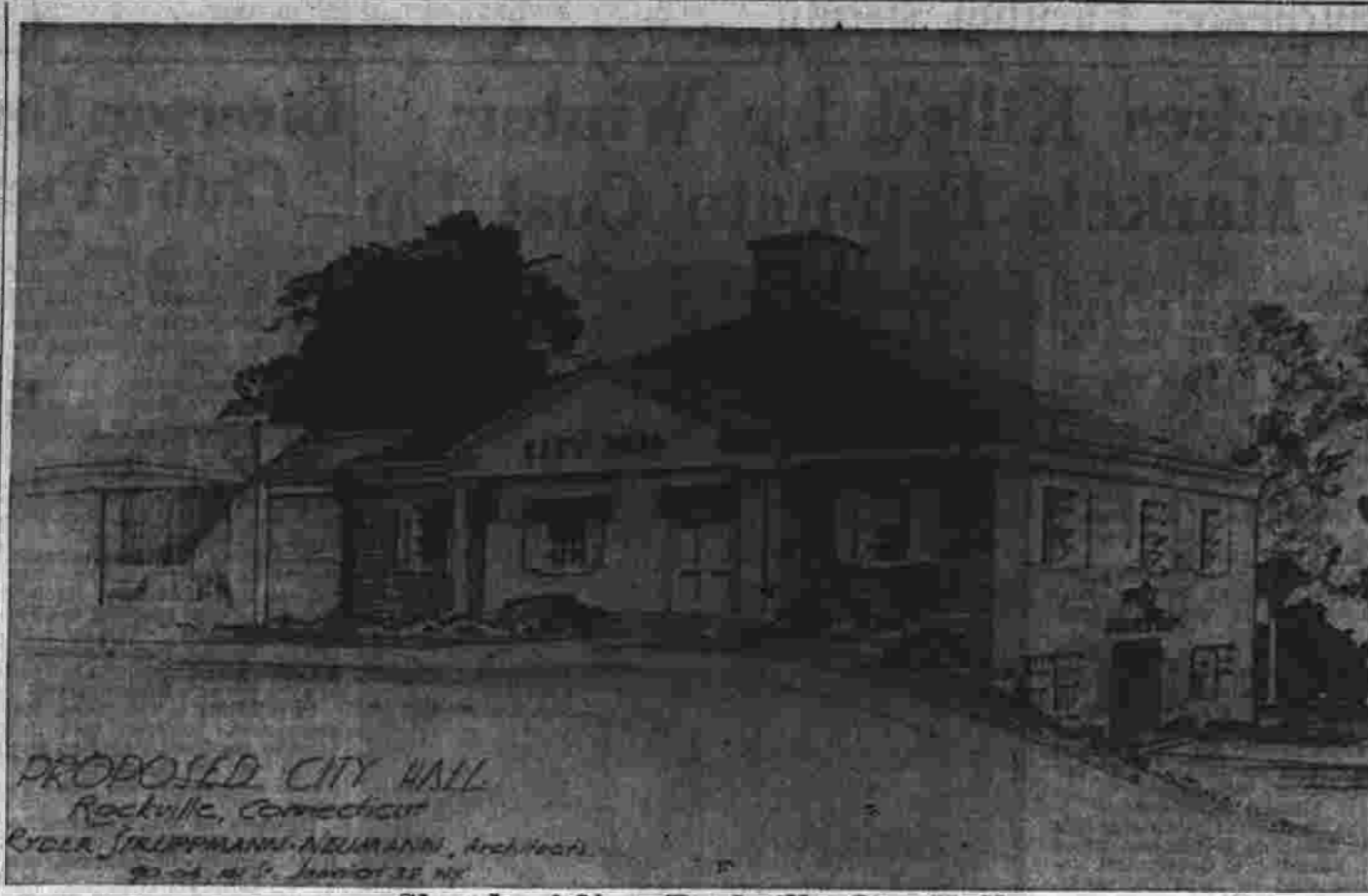

Andover Democrats Slay Tax Talk By Famous UConn Teacher

Andover, July 8 (Special).—The Andover County Democratic Association will present a talk on "How to Reduce Inequalities in Property Tax Burden" at a Town Hall meeting tomorrow night at 8 o'clock in this town's community center.

The speaker will be Miss Dorothy C. Goodwin, the Department of Agricultural Economics of the University of Connecticut.

Miss Goodwin, a specialist in the field of taxation, is the author of a recent article in the Journal of Farm Economics entitled "Economic Needs and Capacities of Connecticut Towns." The article, published in "An Indirect Approach to Equalization of Property Taxes Through State Grants," is based on studies conducted by Miss Goodwin in preparation for a doctorate degree.

Lawrence Moss, president of the association, said today that all interested persons are welcome to attend the session which will follow a short business meeting.

Tax Rate Impact Feared

Townpeople have received tax bills during the past week based on the new rate of 29 mills, a rise of 22 mills over the previous rate. The increase in this town, and also a rise in taxation in Bellows Falls and Marlborough, has been attributed primarily to the cost of the \$1,500,000 Regional District 1 school.

In an attempt to offset the impact of the school expenditure, during the past two years with legislation concerning the Regional Board of Education, the possibility of revising the hardship grant bill to regional districts also eligible for aid. This revised bill was named by the General Assembly this spring following the appearance of regional board officers, local legislators and town officials before the Regional Board of Education Committee in the Capitol.

While the revised hardship grant bill may alleviate the local tax situation, another bill passed by the General Assembly in its recent session, placing a limit on the indebtedness of regional districts as well as towns, would have made it impossible at this time for the district to build its school.

The bill placed a bonded indebtedness limit of \$100,000 per cent on the total Grand List.

The total Grand List of the district's taxpayers as of approximately \$1,500,000 which would limit the district's indebtedness to \$350,000, preventing the raising of a 15-cent tax rate.

Pollution War Costly

In the chemical industry alone an estimated \$40,000,000 a year can be charged up to pollution-removal work, including research, design, new equipment, and operation of equipment.

Recent research has suggested that such factors as attitude, personality and adjustment of the driver are of greater importance to safe driving than slight physical defects. Indeed, the most promising method yet developed for the early detection of the accident-prone driver is based on the fact that "a man drives as he lives."

Thus low intelligence in car safety, for example, would be likely to show in driving experience.

It is well known that youthful drivers have a high frequency of accidents. That is explained on the basis of inexperience, emotional and social insecurity.

In other words, the high accident rate of youthful drivers as a group is merely a reflection of characteristics which they have in other aspects of life to a greater degree than most older people.

Adequate training in driving and to safe driving, that most important method, yet developed for the reduction of the number of accidents of this type group.

There are a number of factors which temporarily influence driving efficiency. Skill is impaired by fatigue, even if this does not affect the point of falling asleep at the wheel. There is an objection to the point of falling asleep at the wheel alcohol, the consumption of various kinds of medicines, and from temporary emotional stress. The frequency of accidents is influenced by the amount of light, by the weather, by highway design and many other outside factors.

The new daily glasses in United States during night driving permit only about 10 per cent transmission of light compared with the 90 per cent transmission of clear safety glass.

Urban Areas Use Tiny U.S. Acreage

Washington—The Department of Agriculture reports that all urban areas in the United States take less than 20,000,000 acres, or just about one per cent of the nation's entire land area of 3.5 billion acres. Urban areas are towns and cities of 1,000 population and over. About 25,000,000 more acres are involved in such necessities as modern civilization as highways and roads, railroads, and airports. To this is added an estimated 10,000,000 acres occupied by rural villages and towns with populations of 100 to 1,000.

"Thus all the land involved in populated places and in the work of modern civilization is about 55,000,000 acres, or less than 3 per cent of the country's land area.

Hartford, July 10 (AP)—A heavy downpour of rain—a commodity becoming almost phenomenally scarce in Connecticut this year—fell on Hartford and the surrounding area last night in less than three quarts of an hour.

The Hartford County Farm Agent, Russell S. Anderson, said that the brief downpour did little to help suffering dairy farmers who need a prolonged steady rain, but that it did give some relief to crop growers.

The rain wasn't an unmitigated blessing. So much came so fast that "normal" run-off channels couldn't carry it away. Some cellars, especially in the northern section of the city, were flooded as were some streets.

The U.S. Weather Bureau at Windsor Locks and the Travelers Weather Service in Hartford both reported that 91 of an inch of rain fell in 43 minutes. Travelers said 43 of an inch of the fall occurred in 15 minutes.
