

### First Federal School Check Received by Supt. Ramsdell

Rockville, July 10 (Special)—
The first payment of the federal grant of \$164,848 for the new high achool was received here today.

A check for \$18,484.40, representing 10 per cent of the total grant has been received by Raymond F. Ramsdell, superintendent of schools following the government's approval of the architects plans.

An additional 50 per cent will be sent when the contract is awarded, 30 per cent when the project is half completed and the group of the architects have approved to the description of the Suilling Committee and the architects have approved the low bid of A. F. Peaslee, Hartford contractor, and are awaiting government approval before awarding the contract.

Peaslee, who is builder of the Northeast School and the East Hartford High School, submitted as hid totalling \$1,475,017 for the entire local project. His bid includes \$4,578 for development of a paved parking area outside the gyunasium. Also included is development of several athletic fields at a cost of \$17,786.

The sum of \$1,820,000, appropriated by the town, plus the federal grant, grives the building committee a total of \$1,820,844 for the school.

Since this amount is well above the contract the entire project will be completed.
