The quote in back of these headlines is that if the Russian skis proposal can be adopted, it will encourage a growth of internationalism that disarmament makes progress on other phases of disarmament possible. "In fact," Dulles' words, "disarmament might come about even without a formal agreement."

But if that theory is valid, and we hope for so much from the open skies proposal, it would seem required that we begin the hoped-for progress toward "mutual confidence" either by tailoring the open skies proposal so it does not confer military advantage upon us alone, or by balancing it with our own acceptance of some other proposal which is tilted in Russia's favor. Otherwise, our imaginary panel of hard boiled military experts would say, nothing is going to happen at London.

**Another Stain**

At his last press conference President Eisenhower said that the proposed revision of immigration legislation to increase the entry into this country of legal and non-quota immigrants. In response to a question, the President said he felt that the McCarran-Walters Act should be amended to make it "more representative of the humanitarian instincts of the United States" and more in accordance with our traditions as a haven for political refugees.

However, it is far from a certainty that remedial legislation will be enacted by Congress this session. Sen. Eastland's Judiciary Committee has been hearing testimony from so-called patriots who paint a dark picture of the fate that would befall America if the immigration laws were changed.

They say that with its population already growing at the rate of 2,000,000 a year, the United States would be inviting economic chaos—not to mention Communism—if it let down the bars. They say that the law should continue to favor immigration from northern and western Europe whose people generally are not interested in coming here, instead of from eastern and southern Europe and Asia, whose people do want to come.

The arguments that the present economy could absorb almost any influx of immigration, that serving as a haven for refugees from fear and want and hopelessness is in one of this country's finest traditions and that the United States has become a wasteland largely because of the refugees it has already taken in—these arguments have little effect on the witnesses the Eastland Committee has been hearing.

However, it can be hoped that they do have an effect on Congress. That body is on its way to wiping out stain from the American reputation in its apparent readiness to pass the first civil rights legislation since Reconstruction days. Perhaps now it will turn its attention to wiping out another stain by liberalizing the discriminatory immigration law to make it "more representative of the humanitarian aspects of the United States."

**Progress Or Disaster?**

A recurrent alarm to the effect that some of our modern scientific miracles may prove boomerangs which increase to disaster proportions the very pestilences they were designed to combat, has been sounded again, this time by the United Nations World Health Organization.

Its latest survey finds alarming things happening in the insect world. We have now had our million modern insecticides at work for about a decade. They were hailed as giving man mastery over the insect. But now what is actually happening seems to be that the insects are developing immunity to our insecticides, emerging with stronger survival powers than ever; some using the stronger survival power to expand their numbers and the areas in which they flourish and carry on their life.

The lurid prospect is that man's use of what he accepted as ultimate victory over the insect world may have the result of hastening the ultimate victory to that insect world.

To interpret the situation rudely and frankly, what has begun to happen is this: The insect world is much stronger and more dangerous today than it was when we began to use the wonder dusts against it.

One device now being used to try to preserve the upper hand for mankind is the use of a combination of insecticides, so that if immunity to one has been developed, another will do the job.

But there is in the news not long ago another and more sober kind of insecticide, to the problem, contained in the announcement of

**Who Gets The Drop?**

It would be very helpful to world understanding if the disarming talks and propositions we could have a panel of disinterested military experts rendering a technical judgment on each proposal as it comes along.

We would have such a panel not only answering the question: Who has the drop on whom, if such and such a proposal is accepted? Then we would have a very similar guide to use in appraising American or Russian propositions. If an American proposal failed to meet the "drop" for America, we could know that our statesmen were not negotiating in good faith, but perhaps being a little soft.

But if any proposal of ours seemed to increase our military advantage in the west, at the expense of the Russians, we would be able to judge that our statesmen were a long way from any real bargaining. And the same yardstick would illuminate Russian propositions realistically.

The advice of such a panel might also prove a rather realistic guide whether to expect actual results from a conference such as that going on at London.

Suppose, then, we make an imaginary effort to convene such a panel of military experts, and question it with regard to various proposals in the air at London. The panel verdict on some of the London proposals might go as follows:

**Dulles Air Inspection Proposal:**  
 Tilted in favor of the United States because (1) protection against surprise is more our need than Russia's; (2) Russia's geography probably has more secrets than ours; (3) our widest proposals would cover all bases from which Russia might launch attack on us, but exclude many American foreign bases from which we could launch attack on Russia.

**Creation of nuclear bomb tests:**  
 Tilted only in favor of humanity, with no real advantage or handicap for either the American scientific or military point of view.

**Agreement to ban nuclear war:**  
 Tilted from the military point of view, in favor of Russia because (1) our military establishment is steadily becoming more and more heavily devoted to prospective use of atomic weapons; (2) the atomic weapon is our best means of reaching Russia proper; (3) we probably have the bigger atomic stockpile.

**Reduction of conventional armaments and military manpower:**  
 Tilted in favor of budget economy, but without sharp military significance for either side unless nuclear war should be outlawed, in which case the tilt would be our way.

**Question of Germany:**  
 A background element in the London talks of major importance, the military tilt being toward the United States if Germany remains in NATO, toward Russia if Germany is put in a neutral zone.

**Taking these appraisals from our imaginary panel of military experts, we find the negotiations at London shaping up exactly as hard logic would indicate. We see for the open skies proposal, and will take nothing else and offer nothing else unless we get it. Russia is far anything, cessation of the atom, and Russia is not likely to give us anything we want, unless Russia gets something Russia wants.**

In short, Russia favors those things which would increase our own relative military dominance, or security.

This looks like a stalemate, and so it is.
