Runway 'Ironed Out' Point Barrow, Alaska—United States Eighth Air Force engineers recently constructed a runway in which materials were no problem. 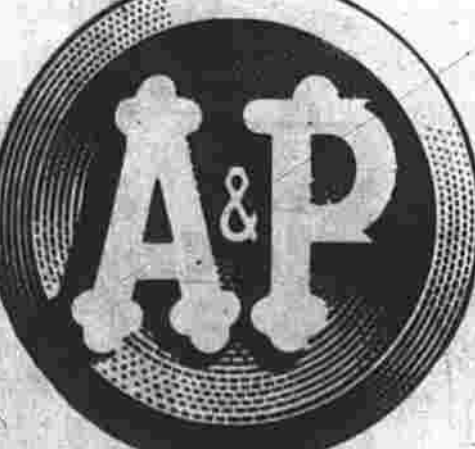

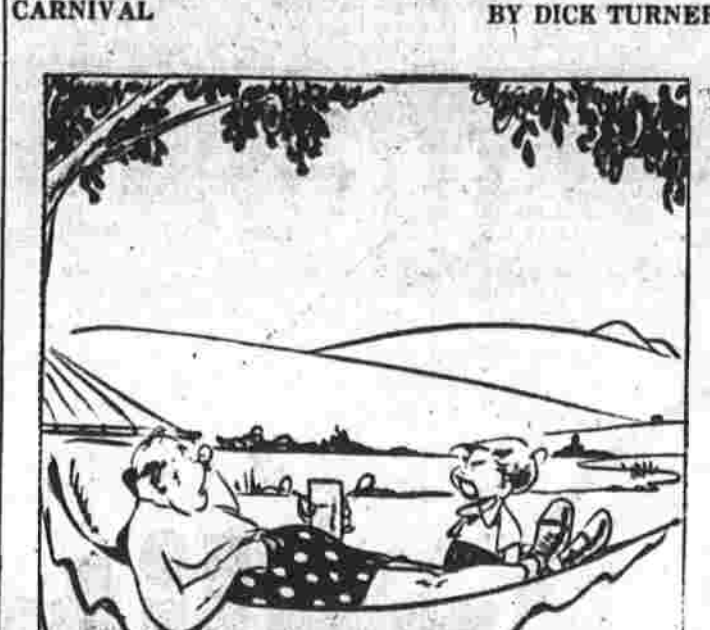
