Bipartisan Leaders Reach Compromise

Washington, Aug. 24 (P) Congress is expected to pass a civil rights bill—the first since Reconstruction Days next week as a result of a new bipartisan compromise apparently acceptable to President Eisenhower.

Almost two years of legislative battling topped by 17 days of party-line deadlock culminated yesterday in announcement by Congressional leaders of both parties that they
