The Civil Rights Bill

The Civil Rights Bill has finally passed, with large majorities in both House and Senate.
 The bill, which has been covered with Southern "riders," all things considered, quarterly. It has been compromised—now watered down, now beefed up a little. At a point where it differs in several respects from the measure first proposed by the Eisenhower administration.
 The bill's original Section III, which would have guaranteed all civil rights through the intervention of Federal prosecutors, has been eliminated, leaving the right to vote the only one specifically protected. In addition, an amendment has been tacked on to provide a qualified right of appeal in criminal contempt cases growing out of violations of a person's right to equal protection of the laws.
 The Senate, who fear that the bill would ever convert them for voting a Negro's voting rights, have tacked on a coalition of Southern and Western Democrats, who are guard that the right to vote should not be guaranteed at the cost of interfering with the right to trial by jury.
 However, the House, which has originally passed the Administration's strong Civil Rights bill but would not accept the amendments it came from the Senate, providing as it did for an absolute right to a trial by jury and applying to all criminal contempt cases, not only those involving voting rights violations.
 The House first narrowed the scope of the amendment to voting rights cases, and then strengthened it to permit judges to try criminal contempt cases under the law without a jury but to grant a full trial by jury in cases where the sentencing is severe.
 In addition, it should be remembered, the civil rights bill will provide for the establishment of Federal civil rights commission with subpoena powers and of a special civil rights division within the Department of Justice, as originally recommended by the President.
 The bill now given final passage is not only the strongest the Administration could hope to get through Congress at this time, it is probably the strongest one that could be enforced. No law can be adequately enforced unless it has at least the tacit support of the public. And the strong administration measure, which would have authorized the use of Federal troops to guarantee all civil rights, would have produced bitterness and resentment in the South, out a willingness to comply with the law.
 For all the politicking that went on in connection with this measure, and there was certainly a good deal of it—this, the 83rd Congress, deserves the country's thanks and respect for passing the first civil rights legislation since Reconstruction era.
 Fringe Improvements
 Elimination of some of the fringe provisions of the McCarran-Walker Immigration Act appears all hand in those last days of the present session of Congress.
 The bill already approved in substance by both Houses would permit the waiver of the present requirement for fingerprinting foreign visitors. By requiring its foreign guests to submit to the dignity of fingerprinting, the United States has acted like something less than a great power.

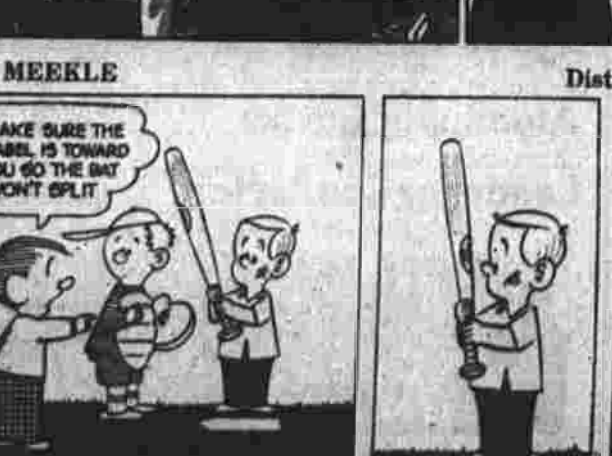
