PLAY FOR LONG SUITS RATHER THAN TRUFFS

South had a complicated choice today's hand. He could try to set up his long diamonds with dummy's trump, or he could try to set up his long diamonds with dummy's trump, or he could try to set up his long diamonds with dummy's trump.

West opened the three of hearts and East took two tricks in that suit. East next shifted to a low diamond, and South wisely finessed the jack. West took the ace of diamonds and returned a trump, leaving it up to South to play for the rest of the tricks.

South considered his two lines of play. If he took the king of diamonds and cutted a diamond to the dummy, he would have to return to his hand with a club in order to ruff the last diamond. Then he would have to get back to his own hand once more in order to draw the rest of the trumps.

Cards Needed

South looked closely at the cards he would have to use in the process. He would have to ruff a diamond with dummy's ace of trumps. He would also eventually have to ruff a club with one of his own high trumps. This would leave a trump trick for one opponent of the other.

The other plan was far simpler. South with the first round of trumps with the king, cashed the king and ace of clubs, and ruffed a low club with the jack of spades. This established dummy's long suit.

Now South drew trumps with the ace and trumps with dummy's. This landed him in the dummy with all trumps drawn. He can ruff only one bid, when you play.

Mill Rate May Remain at 36 Despite \$40,000 Budget Hike

Bolton, Sept. 6 (Special).—Despite a \$40,000 hike in budget requests for the 1957-58 fiscal year, this town may be able to maintain its mill rate at 36 next year, Chairman of the Board of Finance, William A. Roberts, said today.

At their regular meeting this week, the trustees voted to request a public hearing on budget requests at the Community Hall last night. Roberts said it is clear that the prediction would come true only if the grand list should show an increase of half a million dollars when it is completed in January.

Assessor E. P. Puro Herwick, however, commented that the list should not be expected to increase that much this year. He said there were fewer new cars and large properties added during the year. He also cited the special session of the legislature which will convene soon to consider tax relief to farmers.

Roberts modified his original prediction by stating if the grand list advances only one-quarter million dollars, a figure mentioned at the hearing, the tax rate would increase by only one mill.

Factors making this possible in addition to the anticipated growth of the town are the increase in state aid to education of more than \$100,000 and the increase in town aid from funds from the state amounting to \$7,000. A half-million dollar property tax increase would cover \$18,000.

Figure of 36 mill rate for 1957-58 items total \$41,000, covering the increase in budget requests for the year. No objections to any requests were made and few items were questioned.

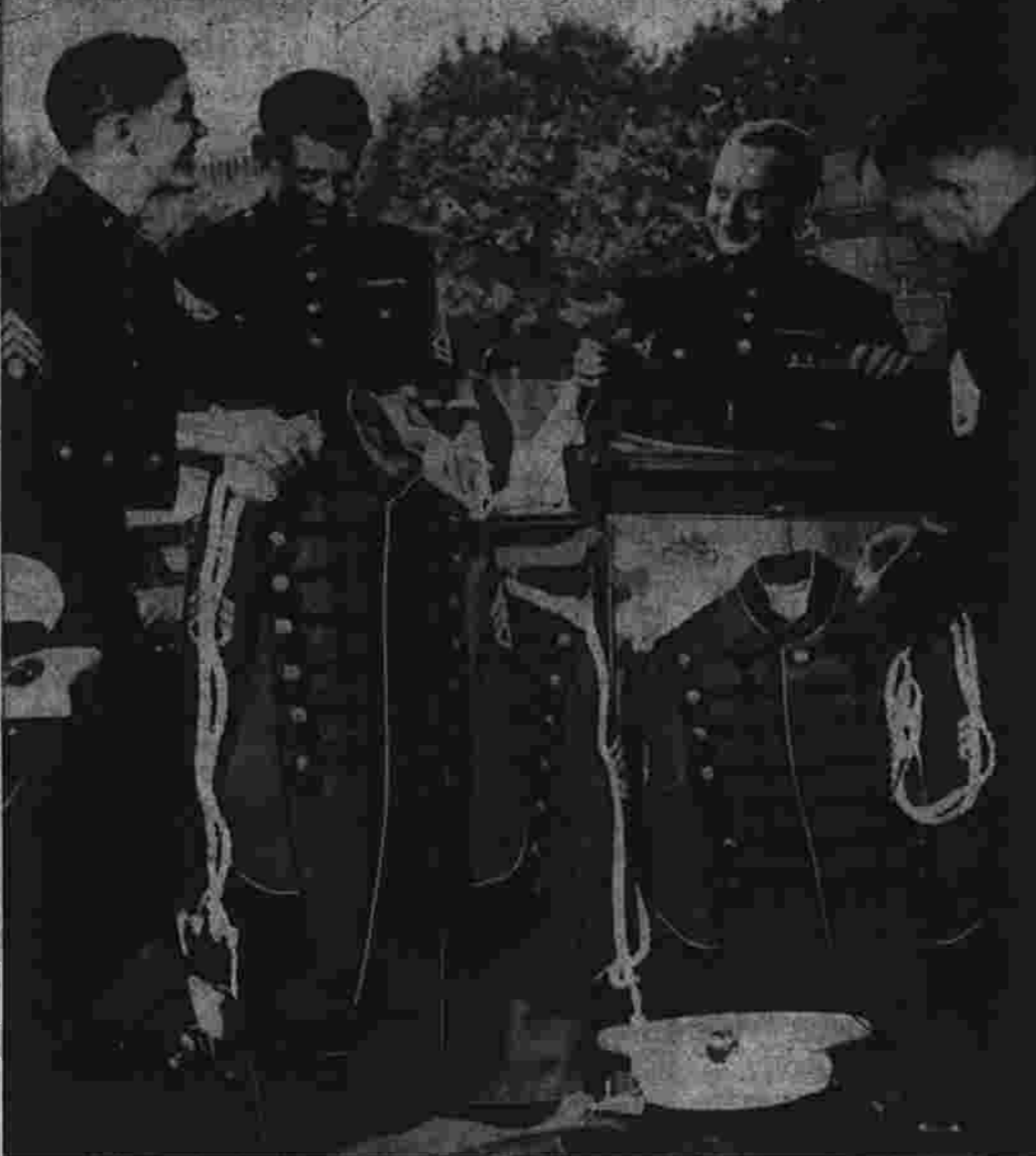
