The best we did achieve last fall was a series of high and difficult to maintain, but it left Hungary free, we would not try to convert Hungary into a state of infinite military power. Sooner or later, both Russia and the United States will retreat from their present forward military positions in Europe. When that happens, freedom will advance into the satellite. But the fundamental bargain appears for the historical moment, only to the neutrals who are not involved, and who would not have to give up anything for now. But it is still a bargain which will have to be made eventually, and it is time it was made.

Mitchell Raps Reuther Plan

Washington, Sept. 13 (AP)—The Eisenhower administration today rejected Walter Reuther's suggestion that the government help auto industry price-wage arrangements as an anti-inflation measure.

Secretary of Labor Mitchell said the administration will stick to its policy of not becoming a party to labor-management agreements. Mitchell wrote Reuther, president of the United Auto Workers Union (UAW).

"You know, the administration has carefully avoided any price-cutting in private collective bargaining negotiations.

"This policy has been a significant factor in curbing inflation and in maintaining the stability of the economy," Mitchell wrote Reuther. "If the government were to become a party to such agreements, it would be undermining the principle of free enterprise."

Reuther's suggestion was made in a letter to Mitchell last week. Reuther said he hoped that parties to such agreements would be the government, the public and the industry.

Reuther has proposed that auto makers agree to cut prices on 1958 models by 10 percent. The UAW would take such a cut into consideration in framing its demands for new contract terms when present 3-year agreements expire next June.

The auto companies have rejected the idea. Some suggested that Reuther's first agreement reduce wages as the companies then consider price cuts.

Reuther said inflation is a growing public problem and argued his proposal is a first step toward rolling back living costs. The Government's price index has increased for 11 straight months.

The UAW leader appealed to President Eisenhower and all cabinet members for administration aid in putting over his price-cutting plan.
