(Continued from Page One) The Teamsters and bakery workers to clean house. Mitchell added: "This and other recent actions make it perfectly clear that the AFL-CIO is determined to rid itself of those men who have abused their office and dishonored their Unions."

"I am confident that with the continued leadership of the AFL-CIO and the efforts of rank-and-file Union members supported by men of good will everywhere, the American labor movement will fulfill the high trust which its millions of members have reposed in it."

The Teamsters, Bakery Workers and Textile Workers Unions have been indicted by the AFL-CIO Ethical Practices Committee, which filed reports with the Executive Council. The complaints of misuse of funds and other improper practices were based on testimony at recent hearings before the Senate Committee investigating racketeering in the labor and management.

Murray declined after the Executive Council's window of a two-day special session to speculate on the likelihood that any union would be thrown out of the AFL-CIO next month or to name the officers whose removal would be demanded.

New York Cases Feared to Be Flu

Albany, N. Y., Sept. 26.—An illness suspected of being Asian flu has stricken 500 school children and migrant workers upstate, the State Health Department reports. The latest report, issued yesterday, listed 372 pupils in 13 schools and 27 workers at two farm labor camps. Another several hundred pupils have been stricken by a similar illness. One school was closed.

Meanwhile, the department said it was following a policy of "containment" in matters of public interest. Dr. Granville W. Larimore, a deputy state health commissioner, said such a policy was of especial value "in a time like this" when there was public concern about Asian flu.

The department has been criticized for publicity given outbreaks of the flu. The department also reported that 30 persons in two Lewis County hamlets and 50 or more in Watertown might be ill with aseptic meningitis, a nerve disease believed caused by a virus.

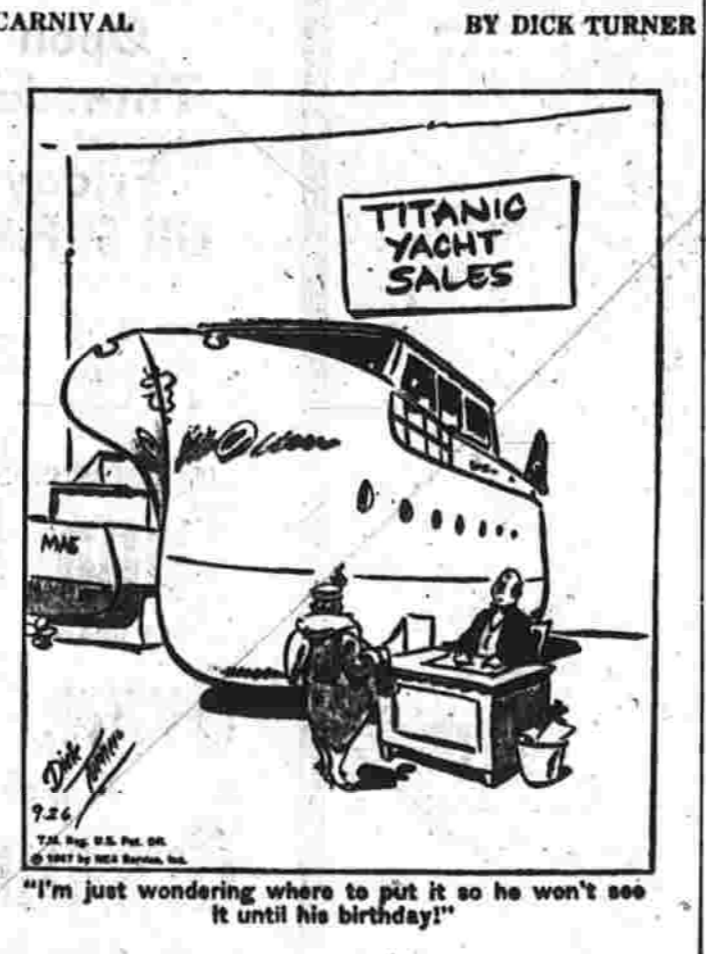

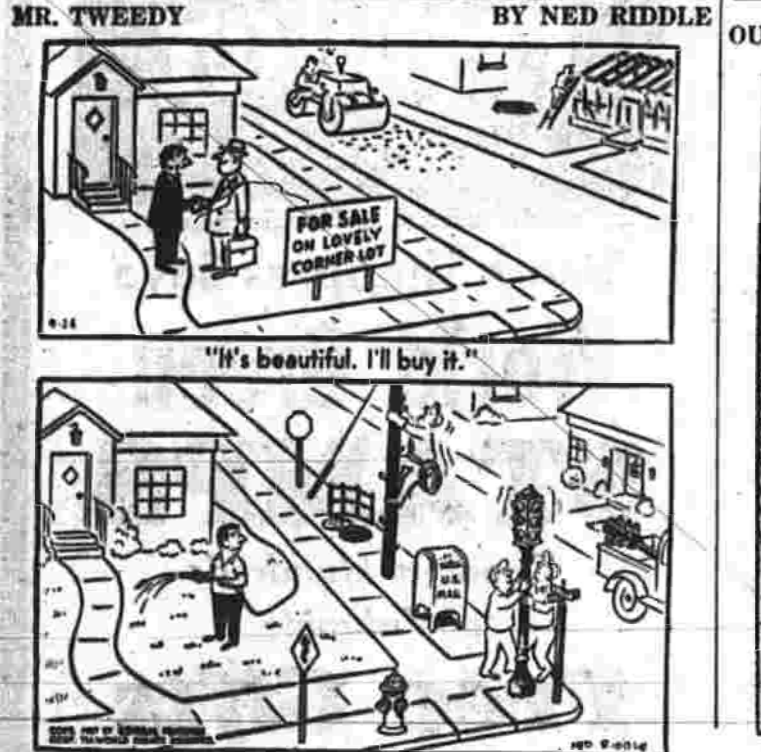
