Washington, Oct. 1 (AP)—Opponents of the James R. Hoffa leadership in the Teamster Union told the Supreme Court today that unless this week's scheduled election of national officers is blocked there will be nothing but "empty promises" of relief from disaffiliation.

A New York group, which chose the court route to oppose the election of Hoffa, filed a statement in the case while Chief Justice Warren considered their petition to reinstate an injunction against the vote scheduled for next week in Miami beach convention.

The last such arguments on behalf of the Hoffa opponents were made to the Chief Justice for consideration along with the statement of the National League club there following the vote of disaffiliation.

The public interest in the election of Hoffa is so great that the court has agreed to hear the case on a date yet to be determined.

Police Chief Herman O. Schenck's experiment with replacing stop signs with yield signs on streets entering through roads in Manchester has proved successful, the chief said today.

The plan for putting the new stop signs on Highland St. at the intersection with the street which enters a main artery but do not continue through to the opposite side of the road—began last night on Highland St. Three weeks ago, the department replaced eight stop signs on Highland St. with the new yield signs in the second step of the experiment.

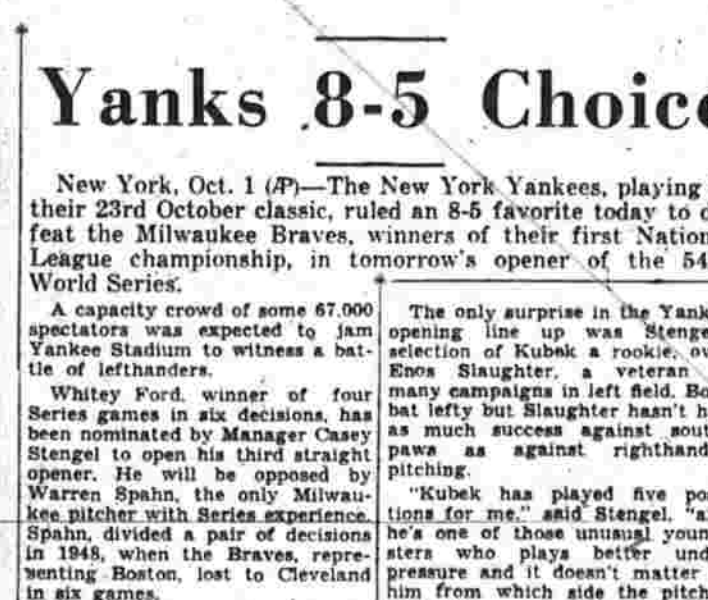
