This is a nerve disorder and I shall try to explain what is invoived. There are 12 nerves which come directly out of the brain. Each of these is numbered and has its own name. In the case of Bell's palsy it is the facial nerve, or seventh, which is invoived. This nerve supplies some of the skin and muscles of the face.

The characteristic feature of Bell's palsy is a paralysis of the muscles of one side of the face.

This produces a drooping or sagging of the lip and an inability to close one eye. As a result, the two sides of the face do not look alike even when at rest. The difference is more conspicuous when denly and is associated with variable amount of pain. The pai may disappear rather abruptly an leave nothing but a mild tingling.
A change in assistation to pressure or from the prick of a pin is common. The sense of taste over the front part of the tongue is often altered.

The disorder may be the result

The disorder may be the result of injury such as a cut or a gunshot wound. It may follow the extraction of a tooth although why this should happen is not understood. Infections of various sorts, especially those in the upper part of the nose or throat, frequently precede the onset.

Certain diseases such as mumps shingles, scarlet fever or influenza are additional possibilities. Possibly the most common event preceding Bell's palsy is exposure. There are many cases on record in which it has followed driving a car with the window open. window open.
The application of heat around the ear area may be helpful. Acfront of a mirror are usually recommended.

A few years ago a dentist, a victim of Bell's paisy, wrote said that he obtained considerable benefit from a chronaxie test followed by electric physiotherapy treatments. However, not all of those with Bell's paisy should be treated exactly alike.
