Connecticut Yankee

If the special session of the General Assembly failed to initiate any legislation, the committee will be dissolved. And Shukairy's speech, which the protesters of friendship for Syria by her neighbors, can be seen as an effort to restore some semblance of validity to that myth.

The sentiments expressed in Shukairy's letter have not been sincere, and the New York Times can derive what comfort it chooses to from the message. But the fact remains that we are airing up a hornet's nest of Arab resentment with our heavy-footed actions in the Syrian crisis.

United States policy makers now seem to realize this themselves. President Eisenhower, at his press conference, reacted calmly to questions about Shukairy's speech, saying he did not know what part of the speech he had in mind. He also said that the original alarm of countries like Jordan, Lebanon, Iraq and Saudi Arabia, in a Syrian sense, was diminished. In addition, the State Department plans no response to Shukairy's speech, nor does it have any intention to discuss it with Shukairy's supporters.

At the time of the coup that put the Soviet effort in control of the Syrian army and thereby, presumably, in control of the country President Eisenhower offered a reasonable policy suggestion. It was, in effect, let the dust settle. Now, it seems, after doing much to kick up the dust, there is a move to block the East, United States foreign policy makers are going to turn the Little Rock issue into a crusade on behalf of the famed virtue and modesty of Southern womanhood. There is only one thing wrong with this move. It is that the people of Little Rock should turn on the federal troops and try to drive them out.

This is the only conceivable objective of his action in charging that the federal troops at Central High School have been invading the privacy of the girls' dressing rooms at the school. This charge is emphatically denied by army authorities, and by Central High School authorities. We can be sure that such denials mean little to Governor Faubus. He has a very ahead idea of what kind of story outruns any denial. He is very deliberately, and unscrupulously, trying to make out of this story a situation flamed into open war.

Toward that end he is trying to give the federal troops involved the reputation of a sexual menace. Just how tricky and unscrupulous he is willing to be in such efforts was illustrated, a little earlier, by his charge that the FBI had kept a Little Rock school girl communicante for a long period of time. He himself, it developed, was the one who had given the girl's name to the FBI, and recommended that she be interviewed, presumably because he knew her sentiments would be against integration. Then, publicly, he assailed the FBI for holding the interview he had recommended, and falsified its time and circumstance. This man intends to go all the way.
