Then came the efforts of the four southern governors to work out a compromise. The President and Fubus both issued statements giving the gist of it.

Only a few hours later, having read Fubus' version of the deal, the White House said the deal was off. Some of the phraseology in the Governor's statement was unacceptable.

At a news conference the next day, Fubus did not look so confident. Several times, fire above through his usual calm as he answered questions. "What do they want to do, write my statement for me?" he asked, raising his voice. He did not hesitate to accuse the White House of "double talk."

Meanwhile, reports circulated that he was planning to call the Legislature into special session. Through that body, he could close all the schools in Little Rock.

Integrationists hoped he would take that action. They said he would alternate much of the support he now has around the state.

When nothing developed, Fubus' critics said he had sent up a "trial balloon" and found the members of the Legislature lukewarm to the idea of a special session. "There the position rests today, as far as Fubus is concerned."

"Some of the kids simply ignore the Negroes. Some are afraid of them. There are two Negro girls in my gym class and they seem so nice."

Daly Doubts Legality of His 1937 Appointment to Bench

Hartford, Oct. 11 (AP)—Edward J. Daly, an associate justice of the State Supreme Court who has been appointed Chief Justice as of Oct. 1, 1957, indicated today that he doubts the legality of his own appointment to the bench.

The new appointments, announced by Gov. J. B. McElroy, were made in a letter to the Legislature on Oct. 1, 1957. Justice Daly said yesterday that he was a de facto judge, but he is not sure if that is the correct legal position.

The court heard arguments in the case earlier this year, but without making a decision. Order of the court was to argue the question of whether statutory authority for such appointments does, in fact, exist.

The court gave no indication after yesterday's hearing, lasting a little more than an hour, as to when it will render a decision.

The Town of Manchester completed 25 of its 80 capital improvement projects during the period from 1954 to 1956, but progress at all was made on 37 of them, according to a report presented to the Town Planning Commission by Planning Director Wilfred Maxwell last night. The report also showed that some progress made was 24 of the 80 projects.

Maxwell presented the 45-page report, the result of three weeks' work by the TPC, to a group of the town's progress in capital improvements and to propose a future program.

In presenting the report, Maxwell said that it was "time for the various town committees to work together." He said that there was great duplication of effort on many projects because one board had 100% what another was doing.

They finally conceded defeat last night in their attempt to stay in power after defections cost them their majority in parliament.

The anti-Communist regime said Capt. Enrico Rossi, Italian chief of the regular San Marino police force, would assume temporary power in San Marino and oversee the disarming of Communist militiamen preparatory to the Christian Democrats' takeover.

The Communist announced they had disbanded the 300-man Red guard they formed after their opponents proclaimed themselves the legitimate government of San Marino Oct. 1, and the anti-Communist said their 100 White guards had turned in their arms. But the Communist volunteers took home with them the modern rifles and machine guns they had been issued.

The Communists admitted they had lost the bloodless civil war after negotiations with Federation Righi, unofficial anti-Communist premier in the nearby Italian republic, and final details will be worked out, an informant said, in the future of the 29 Communist and Socialist members of the 60-member Parliament. After the Communist defections, the Federation will dissolve the body and call for Nov. 3 elections. Anti-Communist said no attention.

At the U.S. Naval Research Laboratory, a spokesman said the satellite came over as scheduled last night several hours after the Moscow broadcast about the meteoroid bombardment. The spokesman said the satellite was emitting a steady signal.

Whipple, giving what he called a rough estimate, said that if the satellite's skin is a half millimeter thick, it probably has been punctured by a meteorite once every five days. But that the sphere will meet any meteorite big enough to destroy it.

Mooney Radio said the real danger period for the satellite will come during three days beginning Oct. 20, adding that this is when the Earth and sputnik will pass through meteor debris left by the Earth's own satellite.

A Naval Observatory scientist said the Earth's orbit every 77 days about Oct. 20-22, and that a meteor shower known as Orionids comes about Oct. 20-22.

Halley's comet was named for the second astronomer royal of England, Edmund Halley, who lived from 1686 to 1742. He figured out that the comet would return to Earth about every 77 years. It last appeared in 1910 and is due again in 1985.
