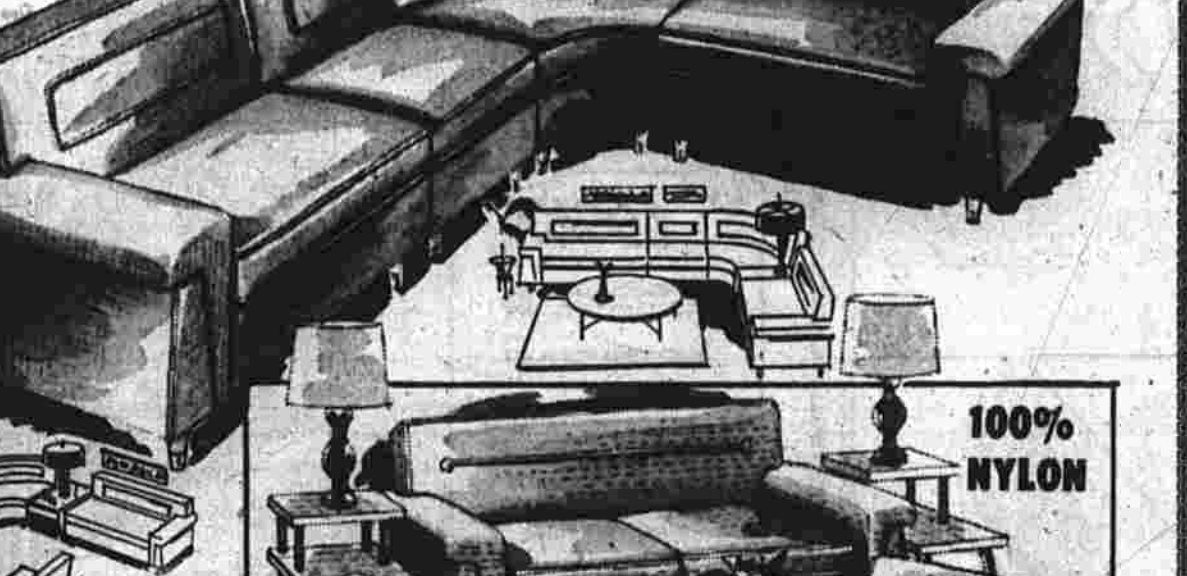

The Doctor Says

New Treatments Curtail Spread of Skin Disease

Every once in a while it serves as a useful reminder to all of us to discuss some disease which we have both common and serious, but which is today less well understood than in the past. This is the case for erysipelas, an acute bacterial disease which is an inflammation of the skin caused by a germ known as the streptococcus. It thrives best among the poor and those living under bad sanitary conditions. It is most frequent early in life, especially during the first two years.

Yet it is more common in old people than in the middle years. Lower general health from such things as bad diet, Bright's disease, or chronic alcoholism favor the development of erysipelas.

It usually starts suddenly and is often accompanied by high fever. The most common location is on the face and neck. Other signs of a suddenly rising body temperature, chills, and a general feeling of illness.

At first, the skin in a single area becomes red and swollen. This is where there has been a wound, a burn, or a scratch. The skin becomes reddened and swollen within a day or two, and the infection usually spreads rapidly. A sharp line separates the red area from the normal skin. Occasionally, particularly in the elderly, the red area may be more extensive, and the patient may feel very ill.

Proper administration of a suitable drug is important. Erysipelas is contagious and therefore the patient must be kept from contact with others in order to avoid spreading the infection. Although erysipelas has almost entirely disappeared, it is certainly less common now in most parts of the world than in the past. Furthermore, when it does occur, it can be treated much more successfully.

There will continue to be occasional cases of erysipelas, no doubt, and any mass deterioration of health or any disease may increase its frequency again. However, if it should again become widespread we are better equipped to deal with it.

More Than Each Other

We had no real idea of the magnitude of the tax burden being borne by some people until, the other day, we read two financial magazine finds.

The first featured the statement of a speaker at the annual meeting of the American Life Convention out of Chicago, to the effect that "there is no doubt that the life insurance business is more heavily taxed than any other type of savings institution."

The second item, from a meeting of insurance executives who met at the Savings Bank Association of Connecticut, Mr. Henry C. Deming of Berlin, as stating that "taxes on mutual bonds were five times more than were paid by other financial institutions according to a survey made by accountants."

Thus, life insurance is taxed more heavily than any other type of savings institution, and mutual savings banks are taxed five times more heavily than that.

There may be some mutual contradictions involved here. Some sort of mathematical caution tells us that each of these two enterprises cannot be taxed more heavily than the other.

But, although the mathematics may be troublesome, we concede the reality. There is little doubt that everybody is taxed more than everybody else, or that, at least, it feels that way.

This Illiterate World

The latest, and probably the most authoritative statistics on illiteracy in various parts of the world, come from UNESCO, as the result of a world wide survey. And there are in the world some 100,000,000 people who would be able to read this report, if it were handed to them. In other words, one of the findings of the report is that about 44 per cent of the world's population is still illiterate.

The greatest concentration of illiteracy is to be found where expected, in the undeveloped regions of Asia and Africa.

But there is also a great unevenness among presumably civilized nations.

The banner countries of the world include Austria, Britain, Denmark, Finland, Germany, Iceland, Ireland, the Netherlands, Norway, Sweden and Switzerland. And, at the other end of the scale, are the United States, with 2.5 per cent, or between 3,300,000 and 4,400,000 illiterates. And, according to the survey, Russia's occasional boasts of complete literacy are not accurate. The survey estimates from 1,000,000 to 10,000,000 illiterates still remaining in Russia, or from 2.5 to 5 per cent of the population, which would put Russia slightly behind us.

The literacy lagrads, in Europe, are Portugal, Greece, 25.9 per cent; Bulgaria, 24.2 per cent; Hungary, 23.1 per cent, and Spain, 17.3 per cent.

Saudi Arabia has between 90 and 95 per cent illiteracy, and India, the brave hope for democracy in Asia, between 80 and 85 per cent illiteracy.

For all degrees of backwardness, the cure is standard. More schools, with children kept in them until they can read.

Likes Clippers Best

Darling's Handmade Ship Models On Display in Vermont Museum

From time to time a good many people get the idea of building a ship model. A look at the detailed plans, the fittings and rigging is usually enough to discourage them.

But for one Manchester man, life is continued to fascinate him and so he built a ship model, and another, and another. In fact, over a dozen of his handmade ship models are in the St. Johnsbury, Vt. Museum.

Leonard Darling, a Watford Rd. is a carpenter by trade, but his spare time is devoted to the painstaking hobby of building detailed models. Since he started his hobby in 1928, he has built models of dozens of the country's major sailing and steamships and models of cars, trains and planes.

His tools consist of a jackknife, a razor blade and a small dentist's drill. The results are worthy of exhibition in museums.

Among some of the ship models he has built are the Great Republic, the U.S.S. Constitution, "Old Ironsides," the U.S.S. Hartford, Farragut's flagship, and the famous U.S.S. Bounty.

Working in pine, he laminates the hull, aboves, belows, keel and deck and then paints the superstructure. The masts are made of birch and pine and are fitted and assembled next. The last steps are the blocks and rigging. These (derby) blocks and rigging are all carved by hand from birch, with the aid of a dentist's drill. The rigging is of linen thread.

A complete model of a fully rigged ship takes about two years of part-time work. Darling says they cost very little to build because they are made from scrap lumber, but that when finished they can be worth up to \$200.

"I'd rather make the clippers than any other ships," said Darling. "They are probably the best designed of all the sailing ships and their design helped America become a commercial power during the 19th century."

Beside the Great Republic, Darling has built models of several other famous clippers, among them the Sovereign of the Seas and the Flying Cloud.

Complete in Detail
The model of the U.S.S. Constitution is complete even to the

knackles on the guns. He actually visited the famous ship at her berth in the Boston Navy Yard to study her construction while building his model.

Modern ships, too, are in Darling's model fleet. He has replicas of cruisers and destroyers and other modern warships in addition to a model of the ill-fated liner Normandie.

Asked whether sailing ships were harder to build than modern vessels, Darling replied, "They're both pretty hard. Old ships have a lot of rigging; modern ones have some pretty complicated deck machinery."

Darling also mentioned some of his other models, Spanish galleons, which he likes for their high, graceful lines, and ornate decorations. Small, Mediterranean types such as were used by the Barbary pirates. Most of his ships have some historical background typified by the *Make Trains, Cars, Trolleys*.

There doesn't seem to be much doubt as to what he'll be doing with his evenings, the Victory's rigging plan looks pretty complicated. Gabriel Daniel Fahrenheit, after whom the thermometer scale is named, was a German physicist.

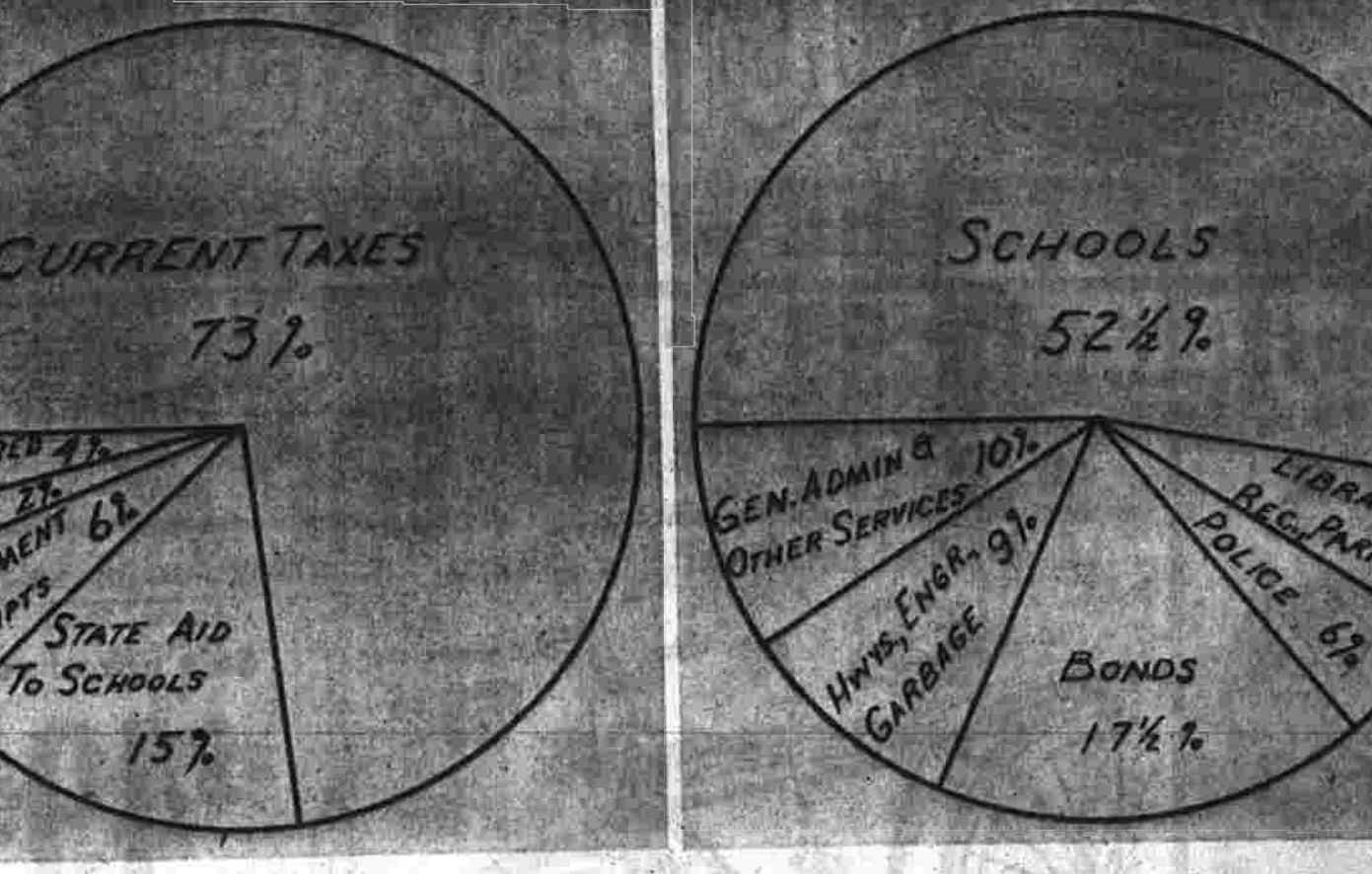
