Bolton, Oct. 18 (Special)—Howard F. Jensen, chairman of the Board of Education, said today that he will see the town in two sessions to discuss the school building problem. He will see the town on Monday and Tuesday.

Jensen said a recent review of enrollment figures shows the town is going through another growth spurt. Many observers feel the current building boom in Bolton is the largest in the last three years.

The last projection of anticipated enrollment at the 1956 Annual Town Report, showed 424 pupils anticipated for the opening of school this fall. Actual enrollment for the first nine months of the year is already a year ahead of schedule.

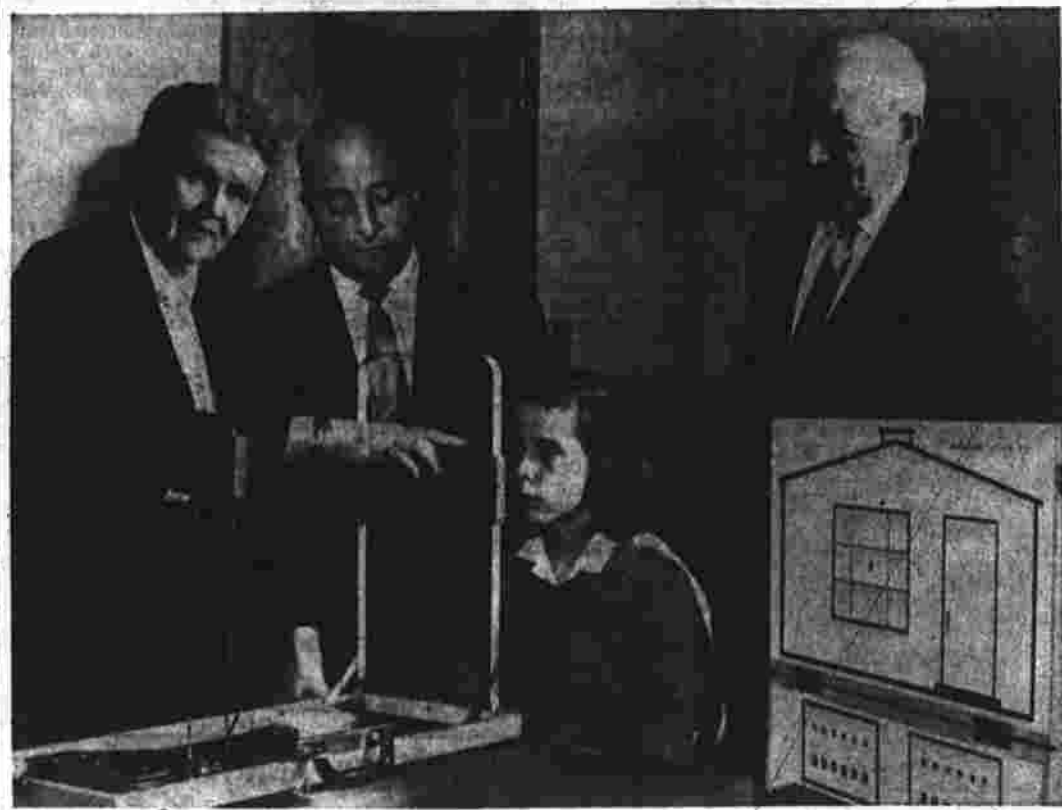

Rockville
Paper Co. Files Court Appeal
Of Aqueduct Water Decision

Rockville, Oct. 17 (Special)—The Rockville Paper Mills of East Hartford has filed a court appeal of the Public Utilities Commission's ruling which gave Suburban Water Service Inc. the right to acquire the local water company.

Writs were served Tuesday on Suburban, the Rockville Water and Aqueduct Co. and the PUC.

Atty. W. Arthur Countryman Jr. of the Hartford law firm of Sullivan and Goodwin will represent the paper mill in the case which is returnable to Tolland County Superior Court No. 5.

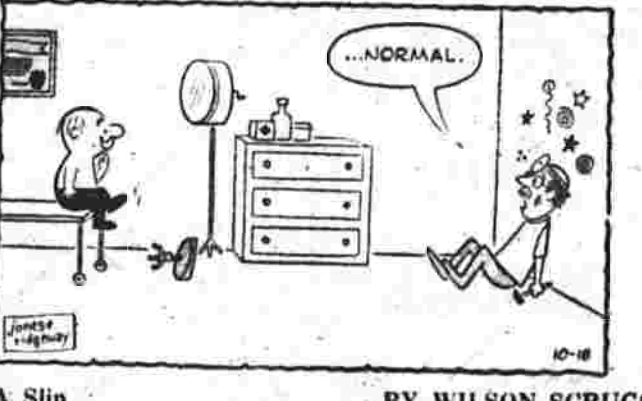
