Louis D'Agnostino, brother-in-list of the barber Bocchino, told newsmen he was working in a barber shop about two blocks sway and ran to the hotel when he heard of the shooting to see if Bocchino was safe.

Washington, Oct. 26 (P)—President Eisenhower is planning to go to Paris in December for what likely will be a NATO summit meeting aimed at revision of Western Defense systems to meet Russia's stepped-up challenge.
