American scientists who have received information from Project Vanguard, the American space satellite program, said last night his latest calculations put the second satellite in an orbit ranging from 1,007 miles to 10,000 miles at its closest. When Sputnik II was launched more than a month ago, it carried to it within 170 miles of the earth and as far out as 569 miles. But these distances have decreased somewhat since then.
