FIND EXTRA PLAY TO MAKE GAME

Anybody can take the trick that the declarer leads. The mark of the good player is to dig deeper and find the extra play. This is what the West opened the five of spades and South won with the king. Declarer saw that he could take eight tricks on the run. He led the six of trumps to come into the long club suit to a bad break. The long club suit was a force to the ace. The next club trick would allow West to take the trick. This was possible, of course, but each opponent held 10-4-1-2-1 spades, but this was quite unlikely.

South decided to try for his ninth trick by way of a heart finesse. At the second trick, therefore, he led the eight of hearts. This was a finesse for the queen. East won with the queen of hearts and returned a spade.

Money Market Erases Fears For Business

high and keeps the money supply tight.

Offering of more common stock to a firm's own shareholders has nearly become a habit of the years. Before that corporations moved more money into expansion funds by offering debt securities. Interest rates were lower and there was the tax benefit of charging interest off as corporate expense before gross earnings, whereas payment of dividends came after taxes.

But interest rates have gone up to the point that for a time bonds and other debt issues were returning as much or more to investors than were yields from common stock.

And companies offering more stock have in most cases increased the number of their shareholders. A desirable thing in the eyes of most managements. And shareholders often have sold the value of each share rise above the purchase price.

Jersey Standard Oil is the latest giant to lay this source of new money. It needs to raise \$280 million through offering its shareholders rights to buy 10 million more shares at \$44 each. This will be the third largest such financing operation.

American Telephone & Telegraph got \$273 million by selling 5 1/2 million shares to its owners in 1956. General Motors raised \$220 million in late September of nearly 4 million new shares. Two largest offerings of common stock this year were the \$221 million issue by International Business Machines, and the \$188 million issue by Sacoay Mobil Oil.

The New York Stock Exchange looks at 12 large companies, including the above, that sold substantial amounts of stock to their shareholders. It finds the market price of eight of the issues higher now than what the stockholders paid, and four lower—and in the latter case, two of them have had three or four stock offerings since the sale, putting them in the profitable class, too.

The number of common share owners of the 12 firms has increased with two exceptions: Anaconda Copper and white catfish, both in a pre-war squeeze.
