## Free World Safety Rests on Bombers, Gen. Twining Says

Washington, Nov. 25 (AP)—Gen. Nathan F. Twining told NATO scientists today that the safety of the free world depends on the maintenance of manned bombers and on the free world's ability to produce ballistic missile weapons can be perfected.

"The problem is maintaining technological superiority in the face of Russian technical advances," Twining said, "and the chief of staff said, 'It's not the center community of nations.'"

Twining said development of intermediate (IRBM) and intercontinental (ICBM) missiles is proceeding rapidly and that it is a matter of time before they will be available to marshal our resources.

President Eisenhower said in a message to Congress that the development of these weapons is a matter of national security and that the free world must be prepared to meet the challenge.

"This challenge must be met successfully," Twining continued, "if we are to remain a free world. It will be necessary to pool our scientific talents and to work together toward a common goal."

The general charged that the free world lies "in the area of future developments." Twining said that the Soviet achievements indicate an almost concentration of science and technology resulting in a current rate of growth exceeding that of our own. So, in relative sense, our margin of technical advantage is being steadily reduced.

## Rocket Sightings Possible Tonight

Cambridge, Mass., Nov. 25 (AP)—The Sputnik satellite that whirled 60,000 miles above the earth last night, according to most parts of the United States today, will be seen between 6:40 and 7:40 p.m. in the East to 7:47 to 9:15 p.m. in the West and 8:15 to 9:15 p.m. in the Midwest.

Fourteen hurriedly-alerted missile squadrons across the United States say the rocket satellite last night, moving in a northwesterly direction, was seen in a series of passes near the North Pole. The satellite was seen over the United States after sunset. It is expected to be about 240 miles high.

Zimmern introduced international relations into the curriculum of Oxford University in 1909 and conducted a school of international studies at Geneva, Switzerland, which was attended by diplomats as his students. He had lived here since January, 1957, after a Trinity college visit in 1947 as a Trinity college visiting professor of political science in 1947. Two years later he joined the faculty of American International College at Springfield, Mass., a post he held at his death. He also held the post of professor emeritus of international relations at Oxford.

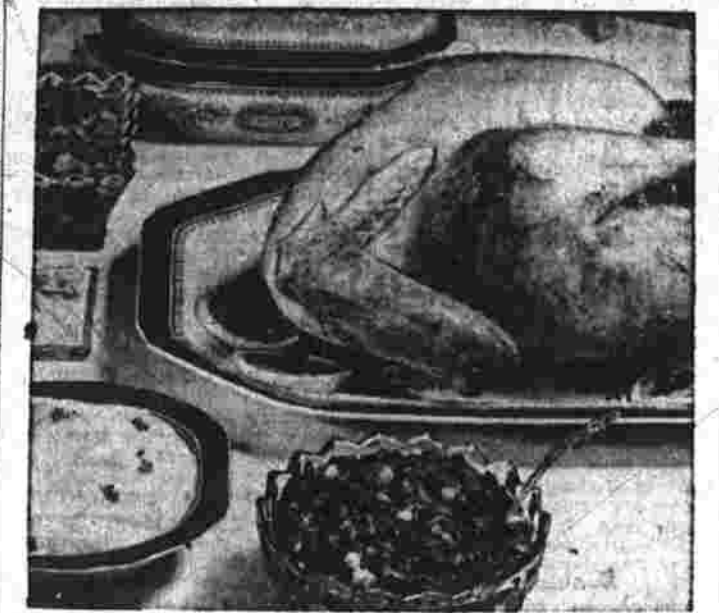

New York, Nov. 25 (AP)—Ohio State, the once-beaten big 10 champion, laid a bold claim today to the national collegiate football title for 1957. The only team that appears to be in a position to challenge the powerful Buckeyes, who flattened Michigan 31-14 last weekend, is Auburn, the king of the South.

While it's true that Auburn has not met Mississippi, one of the class teams of the Southeastern Conference, the Buckeyes have effectively disposed of all their opponents, including the likes of Tennessee, Georgia Tech and Kentucky (which shipped Tennessee 20-7 in the big upset of last Saturday).

The Southeastern Conference is to big it is impossible for any individual team to play more than a sampling of the other league teams. Auburn is on NCAA probation and is ineligible to play in a bowl.

So the best spot for the Sugar Bowl in New Orleans Jan. 1, which is reserved for the conference king, probably will go to Mississippi.

The opponents will be determined by a vote of the conference members. Rice beats Baylor Saturday, the Owls go to the Cotton Bowl, the Texas A&M probably will provide the SEC's opposition in the Sugar Bowl, and the whippersnapper, Ole Miss, will play Texas Tech.
