Washington, Nov. 25 (P)-Dr. Edward Teller said today that if both countries maintain their present pace of missile development "there is no doubt that Russia will leave us behind-and way behind."

Specifically, he said he believed the Russians could hit such distant target as Houston, Tex. Teller, an expert on nuclear weapons, was the opening witness in a broad Senate inquiry into the U.S. missile program.

Spastic Colon Is Common Allment of Civilization By EDWIN P. ORDAN, M.D. Written for NEA Service Perhaps today's most common ailment, and certainly the one about which I receive the most inquiries, is a condition known as spastic colon or irritable bowel.

This seems to be a disorder of ivilization: It is comparatively rare among primitive people, which suggests that it is of nervous or emotional origin.

The symptoms as a rule consist of vague discomfort in the abdomen, with alternate periods of con-

stipation and diarrhea. Often pa-tients say that they have suffered for a great many years with recur-ring attacks of discomfort or pain in the lower part of the abdomen. The attacks may last for several minutes, or even off and on for months. Pain of a crampy, griping nature is often present. Frequently the abdomen feels bloated and gives characteristic gurgling sounds. These symptoms may be enough to disturb the sleep. Constipation is often blamed for the trouble, but diarrhea may present too, at least part of the me. Unusual worry or anxiet; often precedes ap attack. People who keep themselves at high ten-sion are especially liable to trouble. Fatigue and exposure to cold, to-bacco, various foods, laxatives and many other things may also bring on attacks. Treatment is medical rather than surgical. The mental worry or tension which is making the conditio worse must be tackled Vegetable the irritation. Cooked cereals, mill and milk products, eggs and fish custards and similar foods usuall make up the bulk of the diet and decrease the irritability. Sever medicines are helpful, though no curative. Spastic Colon does not affect th

duration of life in spite of the dis-tress it causes. Unfortunately many people who are afflicted with it also have a tendency to worry about their health in ge eral. This adds to the difficulty o treating spastic colon successfully Many victims of this ailmen seem to feel that they are troubled with constipation and would be all right if they took laxatives. Actually, this is about the worst thing they could do since it in reases the wavelike motions o the digestive system and is likely make all of the symptoms worse. Indeed, at one time this disorder was commonly called 'carthartic colitis."




