Fraternity Unit Votes For Rights

Colorado Springs, Colo., Nov. 30 (P) — The National Interfraternity Conference yesterday gave unanimous approval to a report which declares college fraternities have a "fundamental American right" to choose members according to their own stand-

The report was made by a spe-cial autonomy committee. It defends selective membership practices of social fraternities. The report said "choosing of ones own friends and associates is a social right which cannot be con-fused with civil rights."
