He mentioned specifically the Southern Baptist and the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. These two bodies, along with the Roman Catholic Church, are the only large denominations not in the council.
In his keynote address, Dr. Blake traced various accomplishments of the council, including its exchange of visits last year with Lutheran church leaders to encourage Christian efforts there. He predicted:
"The National Council will sim-

ilarly arrange for the same reason and to the same ends further visits such as with the churches of China, whenever it appears that the Chinese churches themselves wish and are prepared for such a project."
