Manchester, England, Dec. 4 (AP)—When winter's blue fogs settle on Manchester, the people go into the pubs for the evening.
Outside in the grime and smog, thousands of chimneys, you see the small children, often with dolls under their arms, waiting for parents.

This is the area of England, the north country of Manchester and Ribblesdale, which for 200 years has been supplying the world with cotton goods. They helped create the United States, Canada, Australia, New Zealand and South Africa.
The flow still goes out, with 400 from central England going to the United States every month. Others reach the United States via Canada.
Beer drinking, sports, football interests and the pictures are Manchester's main entertainments for the masses. With the work week getting shorter in factories and inflation getting worse, there are more people with little to do.

Emigration still is in the minds of many.

Stock Market Didos Tops Business News

New York, Dec. 4 (AP)—With 1957 entering the last lap of the business race today the news picture of the year becomes clearer. Barring a late starting market here, here are the 10 top business news stories of the year—just one in the opinion of the writer.
1. Stock market didos. Not so much because the significance of the market's many ups and downs as because they have dramatized—almost nightly—the other big stories of 1957. From a peak in July stock prices plunged to a low in October and have mostly since.
2. The long boom ends. The biggest business climb in American history faltered early in the year, first leveling off and then by summer definitely taking a breath, etc. When President Eisenhower's pickup didn't come, businessmen began wondering how much of a dip was ahead and for how long.
3. The cost of living. Inflation riled the first nine months of the year with prices on consumer goods rising steadily. In October there was a breather here, too, but still higher prices were feared before 1957 ends.
4. The President's health. The market reacted quickly—first, down when he suffered a slight stroke; up, when he recovered.

Wall Street Watches Drop in Steel Output

By SAM DAWSON
New York, Dec. 4 (AP)—Steel and the metals are both basic to and thermostat for a large part of the nation's economy. Reduced output today is looked upon as recording a slight deterioration in the general health.

At the same time the metal producers are regarded as a barometer since new orders reveal the plans of manufacturers and builders for some time into the future.

Wall Street, therefore, has been paying close attention to declining output of steel and the price weakness and to the reduced output of the plants of manufacturers and builders for some time into the future.

Declining steel output at this time are caused by three things: reduced production by the manufacturers themselves, a wide tendency to live on inventories, and, to a lesser degree, increasing imports.

The American Iron and Steel Institute forecasts this week's steel output at 1,483,000 tons. This is the lowest since August 1956 when the industry was getting over a strike. Or, if you ignore strike periods, it's the lowest since the Christmas holiday week of three weeks ago.

About 30 per cent of the industry's making capacity is expected to be idle. This isn't the industry's best since it has percentage figures on capacity at the start of this year. Several million tons have been added since then.

Steel mills have led to a look at the import situation. Europe, and especially Germany, has made big strides in rebuilding and expanding its steel industry.

For example, at a time when American companies are reporting a 10 per cent drop in steel exports, Germany's output today is at 1,483,000 tons. This is the lowest since August 1956 when the industry was getting over a strike. Or, if you ignore strike periods, it's the lowest since the Christmas holiday week of three weeks ago.

Director Subcommittee To Study Lease Issue

The Country Club lease issue was in the hands of a 6-member committee of Town Directors equally divided between Republicans and Democrats today.

The committee will study a 20-year lease of the town's golf course property to the Manchester Country Club.

Board Decision

He and other Democrats agreed to serve on the committee. Republican Directors pointed out that any decision on the lease by the study will be made by the Board as a whole. Directors met on the committee twice last night and on meetings if they care to do so.

On the same ground, former Director Walter Mahoney asked the Board, "Who are you to tell the people what to do? We told you what we wanted to do with the property."

Moran Head

Dr. A. D. Moran, one of the leading supporters of the referendum on the 30-year lease ordinance, asked by what arrangement the Country Club was continuing to occupy the land now.

Mayor Turkington told him that the Country Club was such as not involved in the discussion before the Board but agreed to allow him to speak on the subject after other Directors intervened. Dr. Moran then withdrew his question.

The club's \$7,500 a year lease on the golf course expired Sept. 30. Officials of the organization have deposited rental money with the town in order to continue use of the property until the lease question is settled.

Town Councilman Charles N. Crockett, who is in town, and Atty. W. David Kelly, for the individual defendants, filed their motions on Oct. 27 and had said they expected the hearing to be held within a few days.

In addition, seeking Mrs. Fitzpatrick's elimination as a party plaintiff, Kelly's motion said that John L. Tregelbein was dropped as one of the two individual defendants. Tregelbein was named in the suit as the result of his purchase of the town property, the parcel of Globe Hollow land near the town's golf course.

General Manager Richard Martin said he was excited, "to put the manager as a party plaintiff to the suit," he said.

Other individuals named in the suit are Mrs. Helen Fitzpatrick, who is the wife of the late John L. Fitzpatrick, and her children, James and Robert. The other individual named is George M. Deane, also of Brown St., who had bought a small part of Globe Hollow land at the same time as Tregelbein. Together they purchased a total of about a half acre of land.

Mrs. Fitzpatrick, along with Frank H. C. Parker of Meriden, Dr. and Joseph P. Carlson of 33 Walker St., have brought suit in an attempt to block the town from ever selling any part of the 1,000-acre Globe Hollow tract purchased by Cheney Brook in 1890.

It was originally brought to prevent the town from leasing a portion of the land to the Country Club for 30 years. However, the ordinance providing for the lease was subsequently overturned in a referendum.

The arguments on the motions will be heard by Judge Herbert S. MacDonald.

GOP Sweeps Election; Olson Wins over Heck

Rockville, Dec. 4 (Special). Republicans won a sweeping victory in yesterday's city election, returning Mayor Herman Olson to office and giving him a GOP Council with a 9 to 3 majority.

The only Democrat elected was William F. McMahon, who will be the minority member on the Board of Assessors.

Olson defeated Alderman Edwin J. Heck, Democrat, leader of the Common Council, by 458 votes. Olson received 1,737 and Heck 1,279.

The only remaining Democrat on the Council are John Schlipf, Bernard Grasse and Clarence McCarthy, elected two years ago with Republican Luther Trouton for 4-year terms.

All Republicans won by 300 to 50 vote margins. Alderman-at-large John Gill was high vote-getter for the GOP team, winning 1,779 votes.

Democrats E. Fenton Burke, losing candidate for reelection as city clerk, received the most votes on his party slate, getting 1,407.

He lost by 212 votes to Edward J. Buchanan, whom Burke had defeated two years ago by eight votes.

Joseph F. McMahon was re-elected treasurer, with 331 votes, who received 1,217 votes.

Nicholas Pawlak, Democratic candidate for alderman-at-large and second highest vote-getter in his party, getting 1,357 votes.

Slightly over 3,000 voters went to the polls, out of a possible 6,200. This was below the 1953 mark.

This was Mayor Olson's third try for office. He lost in 1952 to Frederick S. Berger by 41 votes but won in 1955 by 111 votes.

It is also the first time Republicans have elected all four ward aldermen since 1943. The traditionally Republican Second Ward, Mrs. Catherine D. Moran, the first woman to run for alderman, ran a little ahead of her ticket, although losing by 125 votes to Republican Gordon Denison.

John J. Ruddy was elected in the First Ward, with 210 votes, compared to Harry F. Eray's 149.

The Third Ward elected former State Policeman John J. Yaskulski with 661 votes, 138 opponents.

William Plaska was elected in Ward Four with 455 votes, only 11 above his opponent William E. Weber, who was appointed to fill a vacant seat on the council during the past year.

Alderman-at-large elected were: John Gill, 1,779, defeating Francis Barbero, 1,232; Richard Miller, 1,715, defeating Melvin Cantor, 1,313; Rudolph Schmidt, 1,370, defeating Richard G. Bundy, 1,276; and Karl F. Hewitt, 1,726, defeating Nicholas Pawlak, 1,357.
